COMPLAINT

JASON MARKS, Deputy Missoula County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 7th day of January, 2013, the Defendant committed the offense(s) of COUNT I: ESCAPE, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-7-306(3)(a), punishable by 20 years MSP; COUNT II: FAIL TO REMAIN AT ACCIDENT SCENE WHERE PERSON KILLED OR SERIOUSLY INJURED, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 61-7-103(1)[4], punishable by not less than 1 year or more than 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine;

The facts constituting the offense are:

COUNT I: On or about the 7th day of January, 2013, the above-

named Defendant knowingly or purposely eluded official detention. The Defendant escaped by the use of force, physical violence, and/or a weapon. The Defendant escaped after having been charged with or convicted of a felony.

26	On or about the 7th day of January, 2013, Officer Stepper and Officer			
27	Poling with the Missoula City Police Do	epartment responded to McDona	alds	
28	at 720 E. Broadway after receiving a ti	p that a fugitive, Dawnette Eator	٦,	

was at that location. Eaton was subject to arrest on a felony warrant for probation violations. Both officers were in uniform and driving marked patrol cars. They approached a red Pontiac, which was parked in the parking lot. They believed the driver to be Eaton. Officer Poling told detectives that the woman in the driver's seat, who's identity was subsequently confirmed as Dawnette Eaton, waived at her as she approached the car.

Officer Stepper approached the driver's door while Officer Poling went to the passenger door. Officer Stepper made contact with the driver and asked if she was Dawnette. Eaton started the engine and cranked the steering wheel to the left. Officer Stepper ordered her to turn off the car. Instead, Eaton shifted the car into reverse, accelerated rapidly, which knocked Officer Poling to the ground. The front of the car swung about, running over Officer Polling, and dragging her for some distance under the car. As Officer Polling was being drug under the car, Officer Stepper ordered the driver to stop. When she did not he fired a single shot with his

pistol. The shot struck the driver who continued out of the parking lot.

Sheriff Ibsen located the car Eaton had been driving abandoned near Kiwanis Park. There was blood in the car and in the snow leading away, however, a police k-9 unit was only able to track Eaton for a relatively short

distance. Law enforcement subsequently received a tip that Eaton had been picked up by a friend, Kimberly Inman, and transported to an apartment in the South Hills. Law enforcement located Eaton in that apartment with a gunshot wound to her arm.

Inman was interviewed and said that Eaton had told her that she,

Eaton, had run over a female police officer and that the officer's partner

had shot her. Eaton told Inman that there was a warrant out for her arrest.

Officer Poling was hospitalized with serious injuries as a result of being run over by the car driven by Eaton.

Investigation in this case is continuing.
