COMPLAINT

JASON MARKS, Deputy Missoula County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 7th day of January, 2013, the Defendant committed the offense(s) of COUNT I: OBSTRUCTING JUSTICE, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-7-303(2) punishable by 10 years MSP; COUNT II: TAMPERING WITH OR FABRICATING PHYSICAL EVIDENCE, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-7-207, punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine.

The facts constituting the offense are:

COUNT I: On or about the 7th day of January, 2013, the above-named Defendant knowing Dawnette Eaton was an offender, purposely harbored or concealed such offender or provided such offender with transportation or other means of avoiding discovery or apprehension ,to wit: she transported Dawnette Eaton to a residence and concealed her there.

14 JASON MARKS, Deputy County Attorney of Missoula County,  
15 Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

16  
17 I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the  
18 investigation of KIMBERLY SUE INMAN for allegedly committing the  
19 offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information  
20 contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify  
21 charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying  
22  
23  
24 complaint.

25 On or about the 7th day of January, 2013, Officer Stepper and Officer  
26 Poling with the Missoula City Police Department responded to McDonalds  
27 at 720 E. Broadway after receiving a tip that a fugitive, Dawnette Eaton,  
28

1 was at that location. Eaton was subject to arrest on a felony warrant for  
2 probation violations. They approached a red Pontiac which was parked in  
3 the parking lot. They believed the driver to be Eaton.  
4

5         Officer Poling went to the passenger door. Eaton cranked her  
6 steering wheel to the left, put the car in reverse and accelerated rapidly,  
7 knocking Polling to the ground. As Officer Polling was dragged under  
8 Eaton's car, Officer Stepper ordered Eaton to stop. When she did not, he  
9 fired a single shot with his pistol. The shot struck Eaton in the elbow and  
10 Eaton fled the scene in her vehicle. The vehicle was later found  
11 abandoned near Kiwanis Park.

15         Eaton phoned Stephen Goodman (Goodman), Eaton's son, who was  
16 riding in Inman's car with Inman. Inman was driving. Eaton asked  
17 Goodman to come pick her up. Inman was interviewed and stated that  
18 Eaton called Goodman and stated she had been shot by a police officer.

21         Inman drove to the area where Eaton stated she was which was in  
22 the Madison street area. Inman stated she saw at least 10 police cars in  
23 the area of McDonalds on East Broadway. When Eaton got in Inman's car,  
24 Eaton stated she had been at McDonalds when officers asked who she  
25 was, so she got out of there. She said she ran over a cop and then another  
26 cop tried to shoot her in the head so she put her arm up. Inman stated she  
27  
28

1 was aware that Eaton was wanted by police prior to this event. She knew  
2 Eaton had been hiding out.  
3

4 Inman drove Eaton to Goodman's apartment which is located at 150  
5 Grandview Way, Apt. 44, Missoula, Montana. On the way to the apartment,  
6  
7 Inman used Goodman's cell phone to call a nurse she knew. Inman asked  
8 the nurse to come to Goodman's apartment to provide medical aid for  
9  
10 Eaton. They parked Inman's car at a nearby park and went inside  
11 Goodman's apartment.

12 The nurse arrived with her husband and tended to Eaton. Inman was  
13 present when the nurse told Eaton she needed to go to the hospital or she  
14 risked losing her arm. Eaton then began to talk about how she was going  
15 to try to go to a hospital out of state. Inman heard her say these things.


18 Inman stated that they figured it was only a matter of time before the  
19 police arrived at Goodman's apartment. Goodman then went next door to  
20 Apartment 45 and made a deal with Shaman Godkin to have Eaton hide  
21 out in his apartment. Inman agreed to keep the door in apt 45 locked and  
22  
23 stay with Eaton in the apartment.  
24

25 While Goodman was moving Eaton into the neighbor's apartment,  
26 Inman cleaned up the blood, medical supplies and packaging from  
27  
28 Goodman's apartment. She put them in a garbage bag to conceal them.

1 Eaton asked Inman if she would go to the Eaton's car to retrieve  
2 Eaton's wallet, ID, cash and some illegal drugs that Eaton said were hidden  
3 in a small black container in the center console. Inman agreed that she  
4 would. By this time, officers had located Inman's car. They found fresh  
5 blood stains inside and secured the vehicle. Inman was unable to get to  
6 Eaton's vehicle.


