COUNT I: On or about the 18th day of April, 2013, the above-named Defendant purposely or knowingly caused, with the use of physical force or contact, reasonable apprehension of serious bodily injury or death to Kelsey Clark, by strangling her.

AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

SUZY BOYLAN, Deputy County Attorney of Missoula County,
Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of SHALON JERMAINE BAKER for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint in and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about the 18th day of April, 2013, officers responded to 712 W. Spruce for a report of a disturbance. They located the victim, identified as Kelsey Clark. Clark was extremely upset, crying, and shaking. She is also

eight months pregnant. Clark stated that she and her boyfriend, identified as the above-named Defendant, got into an argument about him possibly cheating on her. She locked herself in the bathroom, but Defendant got in. He pushed her against the wall, yelling at her. She became extremely scared, as Defendant had never done anything like that before. She left the bathroom and laid down on the bed. She then started to back a bag so she could stay with her mother for the night. Defendant continued to taunt her for several minutes. Clark became upset and poured her bottled of water on him. Defendant became extremely angry and pushed her from the bedroom to the living room. Clark either tripped or was shoved to the floor. Defendant then straddled her and began to "choke" her with his hands. She was unable to breathe but did not lose consciousness. She was extremely afraid. Defendant then stood up and continued to shout at her. When Clark stood up, Defendant slapped her in the face. She tried to use her phone to call her mother for help but Defendant forcibly took the phone from her and pretended to throw it off the balcony. When she realized he still had the phone, she forcibly retrieved it and called 911. Defendant continued to shout at her until he realized she was on the phone with 911.

Clark had visible injuries, including a bruise or abrasion to her temple, a bruised left eye, a small amount of blood on her mouth, and swelling and

welts around her neck. Her eyes showed the possible beginning of petechiae.

Defendant was interviewed and said the argument was only verbal, except that he grabbed his phone away from her and grabbed her shoulders long enough to be able to do so.

Investigation is continuing and is likely to lead to additional charges.
