On or about the 7<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2013, at approximately 1:30 a.m., Cathy Tabish arrived at the St. Patrick's Hospital emergency room with a gunshot wound to her face. Missoula City Police Officer Cameron was at

the emergency room as part of another case and obtained an initial statement from Cathy. She said that she had fallen asleep in bed in the residence she shares with her husband Mark Tabish on 8<sup>th</sup> Street in Missoula. She said that shortly before arriving at the emergency room she had awoken to find that she was bleeding from the face. She went into the bathroom and discovered the gunshot wound to her face. She indicated that Mark was in the residence when she left.

Officers responded to the Tabish's residence and made contact with Mark Tabish. He asked the officers "is she gone?" and went on to elaborate that he knew what he did and knew he was in a lot of trouble. A box of .22 caliber ammunition was recovered from Mark and a subsequent search of the residence recovered a .22 caliber rifle and a spent .22 caliber shell casing. Mark was taken into custody and a PBT was administered. He registered a .328 BAC.

Mark was subsequently interviewed by Missoula City Police detectives. He admitted shooting Cathy with the .22 rifle. He said he had purchased it and the ammunition on the morning of May 6, 2013. Mark indicated that he had been drinking very heavily since he woke up on May 6<sup>th</sup> and he was not certain why he had shot his wife. He indicated that he

_	pelieved his intent may have been to shoot and kill her, their dog, and
