COMPLAINT

PATRICIA C. BOWER, Deputy Missoula County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 28th day of May, 2013, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of COUNTS I--III: CRIMINAL ENDANGERMENT, Felonies, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-207, punishable by 10 years MSP and/or a \$50,000 fine for each offense.

The facts constituting the offense are:

COUNT I: On or about the 28th day of May, 2013, the above-named Defendant knowingly engaged in conduct that created a substantial risk of death or serious bodily injury to the occupant(s) of a vehicle traveling north on Orange Street by nearly colliding with the vehicle.

COUNT II: On or about the 28th day of May, 2013, the above-named Defendant knowingly engaged in conduct that created a substantial risk of death or serious bodily injury to his 14 year old passenger by nearly

COMPLAINT 13-1273 Missoula City Police Dept CRAIGEN colliding with a vehicle on Orange Street as he was attempting to elude law enforcement.

COUNT III: On or about the 28th day of May, 2013, the above-named Defendant knowingly engaged in conduct that created a substantial risk of death or serious bodily injury to his wife, a passenger in his vehicle, by nearly colliding with another vehicle on Orange Street as he was attempting to elude law enforcement.

AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

PATRICIA C. BOWER, Deputy County Attorney of Missoula County,
Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

SS

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of BOBBY LEE LAMERE for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint in and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the abovenamed defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

This incident occurred within Missoula County. The Missoula City

Police Department conducted the investigation. Officer Craigen's report is

attached verbatim, in pertinent part, as follows:

On the above date and time I was on routine patrol in the area of Ronan and 14th. I observed a dark colored passenger car pull out onto Ronan from Addison at what I observed to be a speed that was too fast for the turn and road condition. This driving behavior appeared strange and caught my attention. I also noticed that the vehicle did not have a required license plate light. I began to accelerate in an attempt to catch up to this suspicious vehicle. This vehicle appeared to still be traveling at a speed beyond the speed limit for this area. I eventually caught up to the vehicle at Ronan and 6th. The vehicle registration was later identified as AAEQ3312 and the driver later identified himself as BOBBY LAMERE.

I contacted dispatch to provide the registration plate. I was unable to do so because the plate was completely obstructed from view. I could only determine that the plate was a temporary registration. There was a plastic cover that was obstructing my ability to read the plate. As BOBBY was driving east on S. 6th street I attempted to pull up along side his vehicle to get an opportunity to possibly read the plate. I was still unable to do so. I pulled my patrol car behind BOBBY'S vehicle and initiated my top light to affect a traffic stop. At this time BOBBY began to accelerate making obvious maneuvers to elude me. With my emergency top lights and audible siren were running I called out the pursuit.

BOBBY had turned north onto Oak from 6th street and then east on 4th. His speeds increased and he was not stopping or slowing down for any stop signs. I had not seen any vehicle traffic and due to our continued changes of direction, our speeds did not exceed speeds that I wasn't feeling comfortable pursuing. BOBBY continued east before turning south on Orange again failing to yield or stop at the posted stop signs. BOBBY crossed Orange street and turned north through a traffic calming device. I had a brief opportunity to see that the driver was a male. I believed at the time that BOBBY was a white male and attempted to provide this description to dispatch. BOBBY turned west bound back towards Orange street through an alley way. When he emerged onto Orange Street he almost collided with a vehicle traveling north. BOBBY crossed through a parking lot on the south west corner of 3rd and Orange and began traveling west. When he reached the intersection of 3rd and Walnut he opened his door. The vehicle was still in motion and he had his foot hanging out. BOBBY stopped for a brief moment and appeared to be getting ready to flee on foot. He continued south on Walnut until he exited his vehicle at the entrance of the alley.

BOBBY immediately began running east through the alley. The front passenger, who I later discovered to be [a juvenile], exited the car and fled

on foot south bound. A third passenger, later discovered as BOBBY'S wife, SHIRLEY LAMERE, exited the rear passenger side and also fled south bound. I continued my pursuit of BOBBY on foot through the alley until he began running north through an open back vard. I identified myself as the police, yelled for BOBBY to stop, and warned that if he didn't he would be tased. BOBBY attempted to climb over a fence when I deployed my taser striking him with two probe connections in his back right side for a five second cycle. BOBBY fell through the fence and to the ground. While he was on the ground I attempted to obtain control of his arms while he continued to physically resist. I yelled for him to place his hands behind his back. Because BOBBY was still physically resisting arrest, and the fact that my back up had not yet arrived, I deployed another five second cycle from my taser. At this time, he complied and was placed under arrest.

Officer Franke arrived to my location and I attempted to provide him a description of the passengers. I asked BOBBY who was in his vehicle with him and he stated that [a juvenile] and wife were with him. I asked BOBBY why he felt the need to elude me and he stated that he thought he had traffic warrants. I pulled BOBBY'S wallet out of his pocket and discovered that he was in possession of another male's ID card. BOBBY informed me that he had this other male's ID card for approximately two weeks. I placed

BOBBY in the rear of my patrol car. By this time other officers had arrived on scene and were attempting to secure BOBBY'S vehicle.

I could see inside BOBBY'S vehicle and noticed a black handgun sitting next to the driver seat. Cpl. Kelly had informed me that it was an air soft pellet gun. I had been told by other officers that BOBBY had bolt cutters and a large welder in the back seat.

I asked BOBBY where he was coming from and he stated that he had just left his brother's house who lived on the south hill. He stated that he was on his way to the Sleepy Inn to book a room for the night. I found this suspicious because he was not traveling in the direction of the Sleepy Inn when I attempted to stop him. I mentioned the welder in his back seat and he stated to me that he had just picked it up from his brother and it belonged to him. I transported BOBBY to the county jail.

I conducted a DUI investigation at the jail and determined that BOBBY was not under the influence. BOBBY seemed concerned about his vehicle being towed and how he could get his keys to his wife so she could retrieve it. BOBBY did not have warrants for his arrest, his driver's license is valid, and he was not operating a motor vehicle under the influence making his reason to flee more suspicious.

I cited BOBBY for reckless eluding and criminal endangerment. He recklessly eluded a police officer with his wife [a] juvenile ... in the vehicle and nearly caused an accident. He was also cited for an obstructed plate, no license plate light, no proof on insurance, no DL in possession, obstructing a peace officer, resisting arrest, and Theft of lost or mislaid property for possession a Montana ID card not belonging to him (F1276, F1275).

I logged my in car video, BOBBY'S car keys, and the stolen ID card belonging to CHARLES WALKINGCHILD into evidence. I also obtained photos of BOBBY and his back where the taser probes made contact. His vehicle was towed by Iron Horse for inside storage. ...
