COMPLAINT

JESSICA FINLEY, Deputy Missoula County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 28th day of July, 2013, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of COUNT I: NEGLIGENT VEHICULAR ASSAULT - RESULTING IN SERIOUS BODILY INJURY, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-205(1)[2], punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$10,000 fine; COUNT II: DRIVING A MOTOR VEHICLE WHILE UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL OR DRUGS - 1ST OFFENSE, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 61-8-401(1)(a)[1st], punishable by not less than 24 hours or more than 6 months MCDF and \$300-\$1,000 fine; COUNT III: FAILURE TO USE SEATBELT, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law. namely: Mont. Code Ann. 61-13-103, punishable by \$20 fine; COUNT IV: FAILURE TO GIVE NOTICE BY QUICKEST MEANS OF AN ACCIDENT, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 61-7-108, punishable by 20 days MCDF or \$200-\$300 fine; COUNT V:

OBSTRUCTING PEACE OFFICER OR OTHER PUBLIC SERVANT, a

Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-7-302(1), punishable by 6 months MCDF and/or \$500 fine.

The facts constituting the offense are:

COUNT I: On or about the 28th day of July, 2013, the above-named Defendant negligently operated a vehicle, a1999 Pontiac bearing Montana license plate 437474A, while under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs and caused serious bodily injury to minor "C.L." to wit: the vehicular crash knocked "C.L." unconscious and "C.L." suffered from a seizure and head injury.

COUNT II: On or about the 28th day of July, 2013, the above-named Defendant committed the offense of driving or being in actual physical control of a motor vehicle, a a1999 Pontiac bearing Montana license plate 437474A, upon a way of this state open to the public, Frenchtown Frontage Road, while under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs.

COUNT III: On or about the 28th day of July, 2013, the above-named Defendant operated a motor vehicle upon Frenchtown Frontage Road while an occupant of a designated seating position was not wearing a properly adjusted and fastened seatbelt.

COUNT IV: On or about the 28th day of July, 2013, the above-named Defendant drove a vehicle involved in an accident resulting in the injury or death of another person or property damage to an apparent extent of \$500 or more and failed to immediately by the quickest means of communication give notice of the accident to the appropriate law enforcement agency.

COUNT V: On or about the 28th day of July, 2013, the above-named Defendant knowingly obstructed, impaired, or hindered the enforcement of the criminal law, the preservation of the peace, or the performance of a governmental function, including service of process by running from law enforcement, providing and incomplete or false identifying address, and/or failing to inform law enforcement of two minor passengers who were also in the vehicle at the time of the crash.

report of a single vehicle crash on the Frenchtown Frontage Road near Six

Mile Road. Upon arriving on scene, Trooper Silvan observed a white passenger car that left the roadway on the Frenchtown Frontage Road and came to a stop in the ditch on the west side of the roadway. Trooper Silvan observed a black tire mark that started in the westbound lane, crossed the double yellow center lines and entered the ditch on the west side of the road. There were no occupants found in the vehicle and dispatch had not received a report of the accident from anyone involved in the crash.

Law enforcement located two individuals walking a mile from the crash site who were later identified as the Defendant Joshua Sakievich and passenger Tyler Ames. Ames took off running from law enforcement, but Sakievich remained with the ambulance. Trooper Silvan made contact with Sakievich. Sakievich stated he picked up his friend from Larry's Six Mile Bar and they he drove down Frenchtown Frontage Road, but failed to negotiate a curve. Sakievich stated his friend's name was "Tyler Whitman." Trooper Silvan later learned the passenger's name to be Tyler Ames. Trooper Silvan asked Sakievich for his address. Sakievich stated his address was "907 Outback Trail," but was unable to provide a city for the address.

Trooper Silvan conducted an investigation based on his suspicion that Sakievich was under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs. Sakievich

smelled strongly of alcohol, his eyes were blood shot and watery, he appeared to have "dry mouth" and there was a faint smell of marijuana coming from his person. Sakievich admitted to consuming alcohol that evening. Trooper Silvan conducted the standardized field sobriety tests. Sakievich displayed 6/6 indicators of impairment on the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus test, 1/8 indicators of impairment on the Walk and Turn test, and 1/4 indicators of impairment on the One Leg Stand test. Sakievich provided a preliminary breath test result of .089%.

Trooper Silvan later learned there were two more passengers in the vehicle at the time of the crash, minors "C.L." and "P.J.," and minor "C.L." had sustained serious injuries. Sakievich's father called Trooper Silvan to report that Sakievich had called to tell him he was concerned that one of the minors was hurt from the crash. Trooper Silvan was able to make contact with minor "C.L." at Saint Patrick Hospital who confirmed she was in the vehicle driven by Sakievich at the time of the crash. "C.L." stated at the time of the crash she was not wearing her seatbelt and had hit her head during the crash sequence leaving her unconscious. "C.L." also stated she suffered a seizure following the crash and complained of an ongoing headache. "C.L." confirmed all parties, including Sakievich, had been consuming alcohol that night.

Trooper Silvan again spoke with Sakievich who stated he did not inform Trooper Silvan of the minors in his vehicle at the time of the crash because he figured they would make it home. Sakievich also denied that anyone was hurt and stated he had just told his father that so that his father would bail him out of jail.
