AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

JORDAN KILBY, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

SS

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of ERIC J AIMSBACK for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint in and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the abovenamed defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about the 29th day of September, 2013, Missoula City Police Officers responded to 1250 34th Street in Missoula County, for the report of a possible disturbance. The complainant, Diane Keefauver, reported she hearing slamming noises and a female screaming and crying next door.

Keefauver reported the female had left the apartment. She reported the female had a cut lip and blood on her face.

Officers met with the male in the apartment and identified him as Eric Aimsback. Eric stated he had been arguing with his girlfriend Phillis Kipp.

Officers observed fresh and dried blood throughout the apartment and it appeared the door to the bathroom had been recently broken. Eric admitted to restraining Phillis because he did not want her to leave. He stated that some of the blood could have been from the altercation that night.

Officers were eventually able to locate Phillis. Phillis stated she and Eric had been at the Grey Wolf Casino on the evening of September 29, 2013. She stated Eric had been drinking shots of blue velvet. Phillis stated she drove home and they were fighting. When they got home the argument escalated. One of Eric's children woke up and came out to see what was going on.

Phillis stated Eric kicked in the bathroom door. She hid in the children's room, but Eric came in after her. He began hitting her on her legs while she was in bed with the children. He then dragged her out of the bedroom and she began screaming for help.

She stated she stood to leave and he shoved her down causing her to hit her tailbone very hard. At this point she was very scared as she was having to push to get him off of her. She pushed him off of her and she ran to the bathroom. He kicked the door in and broke the door. At this time she was attempting to call her brother. Eric grabbed her phone and broke the screen so that it would not work.

Phillis then attempted to leave and Eric pulled her down again. At this point, Eric held her by her throat with his fingers at her left jaw bone. He pushed down with his hands, strangling her. Phyllis was unsure if she blacked out at this point. She remembers attempting to scream for help, but that she was unable to breathe. The next thing she remembers, she was outside of the apartment and she saw her neighbor. She called for her son, he came and they left the apartment.

Phyllis stated her voice had changed and that it had been raspy. She stated she heard ringing in her ears. Detectives photographed Phyllis's injuries, including multiple bruises on her left thigh and calves, finger print-like bruises on her arms, fingerprint bruises on the left side of her face, and a black eye. She had swelling on the left side of her forehead, marks by her ears and severe bruising in her lips.

Detectives interviewed Eric who admitted he had been drinking black velvet on the evening of the incident. He stated he had blacked out and only remembers pieces of the evening. He remembers breaking Phyllis's phone and stated he remembers Phyllis leaving and the cops arriving. He stated Phyllis is truthful and if she said he caused the bruising then he caused it.
