COMPLAINT

ANDREW W. PAUL, Deputy County Attorney, deposes and says that
on or about the 27th day of November, 2013, in Missoula County, the
Defendant committed the offense of:

COUNT I: CONSPIRACY TO COMMIT ROBBERY, a Felony, in violation of
Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. §§ 45-5-401 and 45-4-102,
punishable by not less than 2 or more than 40 years MSP and a \$50,000
fine; and

COUNT II: CRIMINAL DISTRIBUTION OF DANGEROUS DRUGS, a
Felony, in violation of Mont. Code Ann. § 45-9-101(4), punishable by not less
than 1 year and up to life MSP and a \$50,000.00 fine.

The facts constituting the offenses are:

COUNT I: On or about the 27th day of November, 2013, the above-named
Defendant with the purpose that a Robbery be committed, agreed with

1 another to the commission of the offense and an act in furtherance of the
2 offense was done.

4 **COUNT II:** On or about the 14th day of November, 2013, the above-named
5 Defendant knowingly sold a dangerous drug, methamphetamine, a
6 Schedule II dangerous drug.

**AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE
CAUSE**

ANDREW W. PAUL, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly
sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the
investigation of JAZMINE BEEHLER for allegedly committing the offense(s)
set forth in the complaint in and based upon the information contained in the
reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-
named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On the 14th day of November, 2013 a Missoula Drug Task Force
(MDTF) officer, working undercover in conjunction with a confidential source
(CS) of information, arranged to purchase methamphetamine from Jazmine
Beehler. During the course of the operation, the CS provided Beehler with

1 approximately \$600.00 in cash. Beehler then provided the undercover officer
2 with about 6 grams of methamphetamine. The methamphetamine was NIK
3 tested and was positive for methamphetamine.
4

5 On the 27th day of November, 2013, the undercover officer arranged to
6 buy more methamphetamine from Beehler. They agreed upon a time and
7 location to conduct the transaction. The officer responded to the designated
8 location at the Rosauer's parking lot, in Missoula, Montana.
9
10

11 While sitting in his vehicle, the officer was approached on the
12 passenger side by two males. One of the males was Joshua Robinson. The
13 detective inquired where Beehler was and Robinson stated she was going to
14 meet him there.
15
16

17 The officer stated that he only wished to deal with one of the individuals
18 and the other male walked away. Robinson told the officer to turn his vehicle
19 off and Robinson got in the officer's vehicle. Robinson asked to see the cash
20 before he provided the product. The officer showed him the money.
21 Robinson pulled out a flashlight and acted as if he were going to get out the
22 drugs.


25 Robinson then turned to the officer and produced a pistol from his right
26 front pocket. Robinson told the officer to give him the money. Robinson
27 pointed the gun directly at the officer and told him to put his hands up. The
28

1 officer produced a gun and Robinson shot the officer in an exchange of
2 gunfire.
3

4 Subsequent investigation revealed that Robinson fired two shots from
5 his handgun and a third round jammed in the gun.
6

7 Robinson was transported to the hospital until he was medically
8 cleared. He was then transported to the Missoula City Police Station.
9 Robinson was advised of his rights and agreed to speak with law
10 enforcement. Robinson admitted that he had agreed to rob a male who was
11 going to conduct a drug deal with a female named Jazmine (Beehler).
12 Robinson said that he was driven to the area by Beehler. They met a
13 Hispanic male, seemingly known to Beehler, who was to assist in the
14 robbery. According to Robinson, the Hispanic male provided Robinson with
15 a semi-automatic handgun, gloves and a bandana.

19 During an interview with Beehler, she admitted that she and others
20 discussed robbing the officer instead of conducting the drug deal. Beehler
21 admitted being in the vehicle that transported the two males who committed
22 the robbery. Beehler admitted that she had originally planned on meeting
23 with the officer to conduct a drug transaction for 5-6 eight balls (1/8 ounce
24 amounts) of methamphetamine.
