AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

JENNIFER CLARK, Chief Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

SS

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of ROCHELLE JO KOLDEN for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint in and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about October 29, 2013, a Missoula Drug Task Force (MDTF) officer, working undercover in conjunction with a confidential informant (CI), arranged to purchase methamphetamine from Rochelle Kolden. During the

course of the operation, the CI provided Kolden with approximately \$300.00 in cash. Kolden then provided the Cl with about 3 grams of methamphetamine. The methamphetamine was NIK tested and was positive for methamphetamine.

On the 27th day of November, 2013, the undercover officer arranged to buy methamphetamine from Jazmine Beehler. They agreed upon a time and location to conduct the transaction. The officer responded to the designated location at the Rosauer's parking lot, in Missoula, Montana.

While sitting in his vehicle, the officer was approached on the passenger side by two males. One of the males was Joshua Robinson. The detective inquired where Beehler was and Robinson stated she was going to meet him there.

The officer stated that he only wished to deal with one of the individuals and the other male walked away. Robinson told the officer to turn his vehicle off and Robinson got in the officer's vehicle. Robinson asked to see the cash before he provided the product. The officer showed him the money. Robinson pulled out a flashlight and acted as if he were going to get out the drugs.

Robinson then turned to the officer and produced a pistol from his right front pocket. Robinson told the officer to give him the money. Robinson

pointed the gun directly at the officer and told him to put his hands up. The officer produced a gun and Robinson shot the officer in an exchange of gunfire.

Subsequent investigation revealed that Robinson fired two shots from his handgun and a third round jammed in the gun.

Robinson was transported to the hospital until he was medically cleared. He was then transported to the Missoula City Police Station.

Robinson was advised of his rights and agreed to speak with law enforcement. Robinson admitted that he had agreed to rob a male who was going to conduct a drug deal with a female named Jazmine (Beehler).

Robinson said that he was driven to the area by Beehler. They met a Hispanic male, seemingly known to Beehler, who was to assist in the robbery. According to Robinson, the Hispanic male provided Robinson with a semi-automatic handgun, gloves and a bandana.

During an interview with Beehler, she admitted that she and others discussed robbing the officer instead of conducting the drug deal. Beehler stated she did not want to be involved in robbing the male, but Rochelle (Kolden) said she would "handle it" and would do it with "Joker" and the Hispanic male. Beehler stated Rochelle drove them, with Beehler in backseat with "Joker" and the Hispanic male was in the front passenger

seat, to the area of the planned drug rip in a gold or silver passenger car. Beehler stated she got into the front passenger seat after they dropped of "Joker" and the Hispanic male. Beehler stated Rochelle had given a cell phone to "Joker" and the plan was for them to pick "Joker" and the Hispanic male up after they did the drug rip on the male. Beehler stated she and Rochelle remained in the area of the car wash to wait for the phone call.

Rochelle spoke to a DEA agent after the incident. She admitted that she was with a male she called "Bee." They picked up "Joker" and Beehler that afternoon near Rosauers and dropped "Bee" and "Joker" off and the old Harley shop. She stated that she waited with Jazmine and when Jazmine received a call, they left. She stated she didn't know what happened but that it wasn't supposed to go down like that. She denied knowing that a robbery was going to occur.
