**COMPLAINT**

JENNIFER CLARK, Chief Deputy County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 27th day of November, 2013, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of **COUNT I: CONSPIRACY TO COMMIT ROBBERY**, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. §§ 45-5-401 and 45-4-102, punishable by not less than 2 or more than 40 years MSP and a \$50,000 fine; and **COUNT II: CRIMINAL DISTRIBUTION OF DANGEROUS DRUGS**, a Felony, in violation of Mont. Code Ann. § 45-9-101(4), punishable by not less than 1 year and up to life MSP and a \$50,000.00 fine.

The facts constituting the offenses are:

**COUNT I:** On or about the 27<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2013, the above-named Defendant with the purpose that a Robbery be committed, agreed with another to the commission of the offense and an act in furtherance of the offense was done.

1 **COUNT II:** On or about the 14<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2013, the above-named  
2 Defendant knowingly sold a dangerous drug, methamphetamine, a  
3 Schedule II dangerous drug.

14 JENNIFER CLARK, Chief Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being  
15 first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

16  
17 I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the  
18 investigation of ROCHELLE JO KOLDEN for allegedly committing the  
19 offense(s) set forth in the complaint in and based upon the information  
20 contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify  
21 charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying  
22 complaint.  
23  
24

25 On or about October 29, 2013, a Missoula Drug Task Force (MDTF)  
26 officer, working undercover in conjunction with a confidential informant (CI),  
27 arranged to purchase methamphetamine from Rochelle Kolden. During the  
28

1 course of the operation, the CI provided Kolden with approximately \$300.00  
2 in cash. Kolden then provided the CI with about 3 grams of  
3 methamphetamine. The methamphetamine was NIK tested and was positive  
4 for methamphetamine.  
5

6  
7 On the 27<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2013, the undercover officer arranged to  
8 buy methamphetamine from Jazmine Beehler. They agreed upon a time and  
9 location to conduct the transaction. The officer responded to the designated  
10 location at the Rosauer's parking lot, in Missoula, Montana.  
11

12 While sitting in his vehicle, the officer was approached on the  
13 passenger side by two males. One of the males was Joshua Robinson. The  
14 detective inquired where Beehler was and Robinson stated she was going to  
15 meet him there.  
16  
17

18 The officer stated that he only wished to deal with one of the individuals  
19 and the other male walked away. Robinson told the officer to turn his vehicle  
20 off and Robinson got in the officer's vehicle. Robinson asked to see the cash  
21 before he provided the product. The officer showed him the money.  
22

23 Robinson pulled out a flashlight and acted as if he were going to get out the  
24 drugs.  
25

26 Robinson then turned to the officer and produced a pistol from his right  
27 front pocket. Robinson told the officer to give him the money. Robinson  
28

1 pointed the gun directly at the officer and told him to put his hands up. The  
2 officer produced a gun and Robinson shot the officer in an exchange of  
3 gunfire.  
4


5 Subsequent investigation revealed that Robinson fired two shots from  
6 his handgun and a third round jammed in the gun.  
7

8 Robinson was transported to the hospital until he was medically  
9 cleared. He was then transported to the Missoula City Police Station.  
10 Robinson was advised of his rights and agreed to speak with law  
11 enforcement. Robinson admitted that he had agreed to rob a male who was  
12 going to conduct a drug deal with a female named Jazmine (Beehler).  
13 Robinson said that he was driven to the area by Beehler. They met a  
14 Hispanic male, seemingly known to Beehler, who was to assist in the  
15 robbery. According to Robinson, the Hispanic male provided Robinson with  
16 a semi-automatic handgun, gloves and a bandana.


18 During an interview with Beehler, she admitted that she and others  
19 discussed robbing the officer instead of conducting the drug deal. Beehler  
20 stated she did not want to be involved in robbing the male, but Rochelle  
21 (Kolden) said she would "handle it" and would do it with "Joker" and the  
22 Hispanic male. Beehler stated Rochelle drove them, with Beehler in  
23 backseat with "Joker" and the Hispanic male was in the front passenger

1 seat, to the area of the planned drug rip in a gold or silver passenger car.  
2  
3 Beehler stated she got into the front passenger seat after they dropped of  
4 "Joker" and the Hispanic male. Beehler stated Rochelle had given a cell  
5 phone to "Joker" and the plan was for them to pick "Joker" and the Hispanic  
6 male up after they did the drug rip on the male. Beehler stated she and  
7 Rochelle remained in the area of the car wash to wait for the phone call.  
8

9  
10 Rochelle spoke to a DEA agent after the incident. She admitted that  
11 she was with a male she called "Bee." They picked up "Joker" and Beehler  
12 that afternoon near Rosauers and dropped "Bee" and "Joker" off and the  
13 old Harley shop. She stated that she waited with Jazmine and when  
14 Jazmine received a call, they left. She stated she didn't know what  
15 happened but that it wasn't supposed to go down like that. She denied  
16 knowing that a robbery was going to occur.


