COMPLAINT

JASON MARKS, Deputy County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 9th day of January, 2014, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of COUNT I: CONSPIRACY TO COMMIT ROBBERY, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-401 and 45-4-102, punishable by not less than 2 or more than 40 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine; COUNT II: CRIMINAL POSSESSION OF DANGEROUS DRUGS/OPIATE, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-9-102(4), punishable by not less than 2 years or more than 5 years MSP and a \$50,000 fine.

The facts constituting the offense are:

COUNT I: On or about January 9, 2014, the above-named Defendant committed the offense of conspiracy to commit robbery when, with the purpose that the offense of robbery be committed, the Defendant agreed with Michael Hummel and Leanna Hoff to the commission of the offense of

robbery. In furtherance of such conspiracy Michael Hummel inflicted bodily injury and/or reasonable apprehension upon Erin Sayles while in the course of committing a theft, in Missoula County.

COUNT II: On or about the 9th day of January, 2014, the abovenamed Defendant knowingly possessed an opiate, a dangerous drug, as defined in 50-32-101(19), to wit: percocet.

JASON MARKS, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

County of Missoula

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of SCOTT MICHAEL TODD for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint in and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about the 9<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2014, Missoula County Sheriff's Deputies responded to 4528 North Ave in Missoula County for the report a female who was assaulted in her residence. Erin Sayles reported she was

27 28 in her bedroom when she heard her bedroom door open. She stated a male wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and a bandana and holding a wooden stick entered her bedroom. He stated, "Give me everything you got. Your money, everything." He then hit her with the stick a couple of times. The male then grabbed Erin's Percocet, an opiate for which she had a prescription, and \$15.00 and left the room.

Erin chased the male out of her room, outside, and westbound in front of her home where she tripped and fell on the concrete, injuring her knees. Erin advised law enforcement that her friend, Scott Todd had been in the bedroom at the time, but had left the home because there was a warrant out for his arrest.

Deputies contacted Scott Todd. Scott initially was untruthful with deputies, claiming to have been a victim of the robbery. However, Scott eventually admitted that he was in fact involved in orchestrating the robbery.

Scott stated earlier that morning, he met up with Michael Hummel to plan the robbery. He stated he showed Michael where Erin lived. When Erin arrived home with her filled prescription, Scott texted Michael to let Michael know she was back at the house. Michael then drove to the house and entered Erin's room. Michael pretended to assault Scott and Scott

pretended to be knocked out as Michael took the pills and left. Scott then left.

Scott stated after the robbery, he met up with Michael who gave Scott his share of the Percocet. Deputies later retrieved the pills from Scott's vehicle

Michael Hummel was interviewed and admitted to his involvement in the robbery. He stated he and his girlfriend, Leanna Hoff, met Scott at Dale's Dairy early on the morning of January 9, 2014 to plan to steal pills from the victim. Michael stated Scott gave Michael the handle of an axe to use in the robbery. Scott then got into Michael's vehicle and directed them to Erin's home, where the robbery was to take place. Leanna and Michael then dropped off Scott and waited for his call.

Michael stated he received a text from Scott and Leanna drove Michael to the scene of the robbery. Michael instructed Leanna to drive around and wait to pick him up. Leanna let him out of the car near the victim's home and Michael entered the victim's home through the back unlocked door. He stated he was wearing a hooded sweatshirt and a bandana.

Michael stated he entered the bedroom and hit Scott with the axe handle, pretending to assault him. Michael stated the victim approached

him and grabbed the axe handle and the two wrestled with it. They both fell to the floor. Michael then grabbed the pill bottle off of the bed and ran from the house. He stated the victim chased him, but he was able to get away. Leanna picked up Michael near the Maclay bridge. Michael stated he met with Scott and gave Scott some pills, keeping some for himself.

Leanna Hoff was interviewed and admitted to her role in the robbery. She admitted to knowing Michael and Scott were planning to steal pills from a woman. She stated she was with Michael and Scott in the morning when Scott showed them where the robbery was to take place.

She stated once Michael got a text from Scott, she drove Michael to a location near the victim's house and left him there. She stated Michael was carrying an axe handle when he got out of the car. She drove around until she saw Michael walking and picked him up near the Maclay bridge. When Michael got in the car, he told Leanna, "she got the axe handle." Leanna then drove Michael to meet with Scott, where Michael divided the pills equally and gave Scott his share.
