JENNIFER CLARK, Chief Deputy County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about February 7, 2014, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of COUNT I: BURGLARY, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-6-204(1), punishable by 20 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine and COUNT II: CRIMINAL POSSESSION OF DANGEROUS DRUGS - FELONY, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-9-102(1), punishable by 5 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine.

The facts constituting the offense are:

COUNT I: On or about February 7, 2014, the above-named

Defendant knowingly entered or remained unlawfully in an occupied

structure, namely the Joker's Wild Casino in Missoula, with the purpose to

commit an offense therein.

COUNT II: On or about February 7, 2014, the above-named

Defendant knowingly had in his possession a dangerous drug, as defined in 50-32-101, to wit: Oxycodone.

AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

Defendant.

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of JOEL VINCENT MCCONNELL for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

During the early morning hours of February 7, 2014 the Missoula 911 Center was called by Michael Williams, owner of Joker's Wild Casino, who reported his burglar alarm had signaled movement inside his casino after

closing hours. Officers responded and identified two men, Jesse James Brown and Joel V. McConnell coming out of the casino. A woman, later identified as Tarina Raylynn Ask was observed leaving the casino and detained at a nearby motel room she shared with Brown and McConnell.

All three of the suspects admitted entering the casino after closing hours through an unlocked door. Video surveillance shows them in the casino for approximately 30 minutes. They first approach and appear to play the gambling machines and later the two men, using a flashlight, enter the liquor store, bathrooms, kitchen and every other room in the casino in, according to officers, "a manner consistent with looking for something."

When stopped by officers, Brown said his name was "Tim" and that he entered the casino thinking, "someone could possibly be tied up" inside. He said he was about to call 911 when officer arrived.

All three suspects were arrested. When McConnell was being booked at the Missoula County Detention Facility white tablets, identified as the prescription narcotic Oxycodone, were found in the cellophane wrapper of a package of cigarettes on his person. A later search of the room shared by McConnell, Brown and Ask at the Traveler's Inn Motel disclosed a white powder presumptively identified as methamphetamine, a glass pipe with
