JORDAN KILBY, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of JAMES JOSEPH PAXTON for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On April 2, 2014 at approximately 1:58, Missoula City Police Officers responded to Larchmont Golf Court in Missoula County for the report of multiple burglary alarms. Officer Slater arrived and observed a broken

 east-facing window and a door open to the dining area. Officer Slater entered the dining room and saw a cash register on the floor with miscellaneous changed scattered about. There was what looked like a closed circuit camera mount on the ground and wires were coming from the ceiling. In the dining room area, at the broken window, Officer Slater located a large rock on the floor. The responder from the golf course stated there would not have been any cash in the register, however; officers later discovered that \$250 was missing from the register.

Other officers entered the maintenance shop of the Larchmont Golf Course. They observed the garage door was open. The desk in the shop had been opened and was rifled through. There were miscellaneous papers thrown around within the drawer. There were also papers on the floor below the drawer.

Officers learned that Sgt. Odlin contacted two males in the area while Sgt. Odlin was searching the perimeter. One male, Michael Skow, gave his address of 1637 Montana Street. The other male was identified as James Paxton. Sgt. Odlin released the males after confirming their identity. No other suspects were found in or around the area at the time.

Officer Martini reviewed survellience video of the incident. The video showed two males jump over the cashier's stand in the kitchen area. One

male, later identified as James Paxton, was wearing camo pants and a jack of an unknown color. He had a beard and a knit cap on. The other male, later identified as Michael Skow, was wearing a jacket with a hooded sweatshirt with the hoodup. The video showed Skow had glasses. The video then showed Paxton reach up and grab the camera and pull it out of the wall, ending the video. Both males in the video matched the description of the males contacted by Sgt. Odlin.

Officer Martini responded to 1637 Montana. Upon arrival they spotted a male matching the description of one of the males on the surveillance video. The male was wearing camo pants and a brown carhart jacket. Both Officer Martini and Officer Harrington recognized the male as one of the males on the surveillance video. The male was identified as James Paxton. Paxton was arrested for the burglary. On his person, officers found small bills consisting of \$10's, \$5's and \$1's. The amount totaled \$125, half of the amount missing from the register.

Officer Rose went to 1637 to try to locate Michael Skow. He knocked on the door and Linda Skow came to answer. Officer Rose asked to speak with Michael and was told by Linda that Michael was not home. Linda went inside, but came back and told officers that Michael was in the bathroom.

Officer Rose recognized Michael as one of the males in the surveillance

1	video. Michael was placed under arrest. He denied the burglary. When					
2	asked where the coat he was wearing was, Michael stated he did not know					
4	what Officer Rose was talking about. However, Linda heard the question					
5	and brought out two camouflaged jackets.
