COMPLAINT

DOROTHY BROWNLOW, Deputy County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 8th day of July, 2014, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of COUNT I: AGGRAVATED ASSAULT - REASONABLE APPREHENSION, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-202, punishable by 20 years MSP and \$50,000 fine; COUNT II: ATTEMPTED SEXUAL ASSAULT, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-502(1) & 45-4-103, punishable by 6 months MCDF and/or \$500 fine; and on or about the 5<sup>th</sup> day of July, 2014, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offense of COUNT III: SEXUAL ASSAULT, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-502(1), punishable by 6 months MCDF and/or \$500 fine.

The facts constituting the offense are:

COUNT I: On or about the 8th day of July, 2014, the above-named Defendant purposely or knowingly, with the use of physical force or contact, caused reasonable apprehension of serious bodily injury or death in another by coming up behind Jane Doe and strangling her by wrapping his arms around her neck and squeezing her neck.


1           COUNT II: On or about the 8th day of July, 2014, the above-named Defendant,  
2 with the purpose to commit a sexual assault on Jane Doe, committed an act toward the  
3 offense by following Jane Doe and sneaking up on her with the intent to grab her  
4 breasts.

6           COUNT III: On or about the 5th day of July, 2014, the above-named Defendant  
7 knowingly subjected Jane Doe2 to sexual contact by grabbing her buttocks without  
8 consent.

**AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE**

DOROTHY BROWNLOW, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly  
sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of  
WILLIAM ASHLEY SANDEL II for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the  
complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe  
probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the  
accompanying complaint.

On or about the 8<sup>th</sup> day of July, 2014 Missoula Police Officers responded to a  
report of an assault in progress at the Higgins Street Bridge in Missoula, Montana.  
When officers arrived they located three males standing over another male later  
identified as William Sandel. Sandel, who was bleeding from his left arm, said he had  
been jumped by four guys. Sandel was in his socks and did not have shoes on. The  
officers at the scene took statements from the witnesses present and determined that  
Sandel had assaulted Jane Doe on the Higgins Street Bridge. Sandel is 28 years old,  
5'7" tall, 135 pounds, with blonde hair.

1 Jane Doe told Officer Colyer that she was walking home heading south across  
2 the Higgins Street Bridge when a male put both of his arms around her neck from  
3 behind and began squeezing. Jane Doe said she "almost blacked out multiple times."  
4 The male then pulled her to the ground as she attempted to scream and free herself.  
5

6 There were numerous witnesses present, both on Higgins Street and in Caras  
7 Park. Logan Koerner heard the female yell for help and for the male to get off of her.  
8 Logan saw Sandel crouched over the female with his arms spread out. Kory Mckessick  
9 reported that he was sitting beneath the pavilion in Caras Park. He heard a female  
10 voice coming from the bridge yelling and screaming for help. He could see two people  
11 fighting or wrestling on the ground. Kory ran up the stairs, at which time Sandel took off  
12 running. Kory saw Sandel run north on Higgins and turn west on Front. Sandel fled  
13 down into Caras Park where he tried hiding behind some garbage cans. Witness Austin  
14 Vandehey said he heard the female on the bridge yell that the male was trying to rape  
15 her. Austin ran towards her and saw Sandel jump off her and leave. Austin found  
16 Sandel hiding behind the dumpsters. Officers located a blue bandana approximately 2-  
17 3 feet away from where Sandel was stopped. In addition they found Sandel's shoes  
18 near the Wilma Theatre.

22 Missoula Police Detectives Lear and Chrestenson interviewed Jane Doe the  
23 following day. Jane Doe told them that she was walking home at approximately 10:26  
24 p.m. after meeting with friends. She felt she would be safe since there were lots of  
25 people walking around downtown. Before the Higgins Street Bridge she felt a presence  
26 behind her. When she was on the bridge she looked to her right and saw the shadow of  
27 a man. He wrapped the crooks of his elbows around her neck. Jane Doe stated she

1 was able to scream "a tiny bit" but then he squeezed harder and she felt like she was  
2 losing consciousness. They ended up on the ground with Jane Doe facing the street  
3 and Sandel behind her continuing to strangle her. Jane Doe said she thought she was  
4 going to die. She was able to scratch at Sandel's arms and pull one arm away enough  
5 to be able to scream. At that point a car, a woman on a bike, and a pedestrian all  
6 stopped. Sandel ran away.  
7

8         The detectives interviewed Sandel at the Detention Facility. Sandel admitted that  
9 he was riding a bike on Higgins Avenue when he saw Jane Doe. He said he was horny  
10 and wanted to do something with someone new. He admitted he took his shoes off by  
11 the Wilma Theatre so he could be sneaky. Sandel admitted that if he had been able to  
12 "choke her out" he would have felt her breasts. He stated that he thought about having  
13 sex with her but that he would have been too scared.


15         The description of Sandel was similar to the physical description of a suspect that  
16 had committed a sexual assault on the Kim Williams Trail on July 5, 2014. At  
17 approximately 6:00 p.m. on July 5, 2014 Jane Doe2 was walking on the Kim Williams  
18 Trail. A male grabbed her buttocks from behind. When she turned around the male  
19 grabbed her shoulders. He said he thought she was his girlfriend. Jane Doe2 ran away  
20 from the male and reported the assault to law enforcement. Missoula Police Officers  
21 responded. Jane Doe2 described the male as a white male, age 22-28, 5'6-7", 140-  
22 150 pounds. Two other walkers in the area made contact with a male in the area where  
23 the suspect was said to be, and located a male walking his bicycle. The male matched  
24 the description but when officer arrived they were not able to locate the suspect but did  
25

1 find a campsite approximately 30 yards off of the trail. One of the backpacks located  
2 had the name "Bill" written on it.

3  
4 During Sandel's interview on July 9 the detectives questioned Sandel about the  
5 June 5 assault. He admitted that he grabbed a female's buttocks. He stated he was  
6 "just trying to cop a feel."





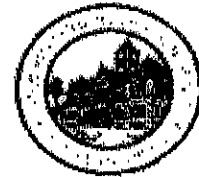
