JESSICA FINLEY, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of DONALD GARY TOWN for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about the 18th day of September, 2014, the Montana Internet Crimes

Against Children task force along with members of the Missoula Police Department
responded to a personal ad they discovered posted on Craigslist. The post sought
sexual encounters with "young skinny" males. An undercover detective posed as a 14year-old male child emailed the poster asking how "young." The poster responded,
"Just don't want old...! like younger." The undercover detective provided a phone
number and stated he was 14-years-old and in high school.

On September 20, 2014, the poster began sending the undercover detective text messages and identified himself as a 42-year-old male named "Don." The undercover detective learned the poster was the Defendant Donald Gary Town. During the text conversation, the Defendant stated he wished the undercover detective was older because he really wanted to meet him. The undercover detective suggested maybe in a few years. The Defendant continued, "Damn! It would be fun just to play with each other to start with."

The next day the Defendant asked the undercover detective for "dirty pics." The undercover detective responded that he was apprehensive to send those types of pictures. The Defendant's text messages escalated in a sexual manner stating his penis "was over seven and half inches and very thick...how about yours" and indicated he wanted to the meet the undercover detective. The Defendant began to discuss a situation he was imagining with the 14-year-old; the Defendant texted, "I imagine what it would be like to play with each other jacking off. I imagine if you were at my house and we were playing with the Playstation. And I looked at your crotch and you were throbbing. Ask you if I could see it and maybe play with it and you said yeah if I can see him play with yours too." The Defendant added, "I would love to get naked with you. I'm so hard right now" and continued to text very sexually graphic messages to the undercover detective. The Defendant also indicated he painted houses for a living and would share some of his money with the undercover detective.

On September 23, 2014, the text message conversation continued with the Defendant stating, "I wish you could come over for a little while." At this point, the undercover detective began making plans with the Defendant to meet. The undercover

detective told the Defendant he was living in an apartment with his mother and brother. The Defendant agreed to pick him at 7:00 p.m. Around 7:00 p.m., officers observed the Defendant driving near the address given by the undercover detective. Officers initiated a traffic stop and placed the Defendant under arrest. The undercover detective identified himself to the Defendant. The Defendant asked to call his boss to make arrangements for his truck. During the conversation with his boss, the Defendant stated he was in trouble for meeting a 14-year-old and he was going back to prison.

The Defendant agreed to speak with detectives at the Missoula Police

Department. When asked what the Defendant would have done if the 14-year-old child was there instead of law enforcement the Defendant stated, "I would have picked him up." The Defendant further stated, "I knew the whole time what I was doing, I was grooming you."
