**COUNT I:** AGGRAVATED ASSAULT - BODILY INJURY, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-202, punishable by 20 years MSP and \$50,000 fine.

The facts constituting the offense are:

**COUNT I:** On or about the 24<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2014, the above-named Defendant purposely or knowingly caused serious bodily injury to Les Gapay by striking him in the eye.

AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

ANDREW W. PAUL, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of SEAN LEE MARCEAU for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about the 24<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2014, police officers responded to Walmart on North Reserve for a report of assault. On scene, Officer Woods made contact with a couple who had witnessed the incident from their car in the parking lot. They both reported that an older man (Gapay) was attacked by a male who pulled Gapay and then punched him in the face. They honked their car horn and the attacker took off running.

Woods then made contact with the victim named Les Gapay. Gapay was about to be transported to the hospital for medical treatment. Woods proceeded to St.

Patrick's Emergency Room to speak with Gapay. Woods observed that Gapay had a

 severe injury to his eye. The eye was dark, completely swollen shut and bleeding down his face. Gapay had abrasions to both his right knee and his right elbow. Woods took photos of the injuries. Gapay said that he was walking out of the Walmart when he saw two males pushing shopping carts. He said that they sounded drunk. One of the males came over and slugged Gapay in the chest. Gapay told the males that he was going to call 9-1-1 and began to walk away. The males grabbed Gapay but he was able to dial 9-1-1. When he did so, the two males ran away.

Then, a third male came up from behind Gapay and punched him in the eye, knocking him to the ground. Gapay said his attacker seemed crazed and kept punching him in the face. Gapay described the third male as stocky, about 5'10" and was wearing a white shirt.

Officer Craigen reviewed video surveillance of the incident. He and other officers were able to identify Sean Marceau (Defendant) as the third attacker who came up from behind Gapay and punched him in the eye. The other two males who initially made contact with Gapay were identified as Eric Thomas and Albert Thomas. Defendant is known to associate with Eric and Albert. Craigen has observed Defendant driving a blue sedan and witnesses to the attack said that Defendant left in a blue car.

On the 25<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2014, Detective Franke conducted a follow up investigation. Franke spoke with Gapay at the hospital. Gapay reported that he had a 95% chance of losing all vision in his injured eye. Gapay had a ruptured eye globe. Gapay said he might not just lose his eyesight but might lose the eye, altogether.

Franke reviewed the surveillance footage and found that it was consistent with Gapay's account. On the video, Franke observed Defendant, wearing a white shirt,
