COMPLAINT

MATT JENNINGS. Deputy County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 20th day of February, 2015, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of COUNT I: CHILD CRIMINAL ENDANGERMENT, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. § 45-5-628(1)(e), punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine: COUNT II: RECKLESS DRIVING, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. § 61-8-301(1)(a), punishable by 90 days MCDF and/or \$25-\$300 fine; COUNT III: DRIVING A MOTOR VEHICLE WHILE UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL OR DRUGS - 3RD OFFENSE, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. § 61-8-401(1)(a)[3rd], punishable by not less than 30 days or more than 1 year MCDF and \$1,000-\$5,000 fine.

The facts constituting the offense are:

COUNT 1: On or about the 20th day of February, 2015, the above-named Defendant committed the offense of criminal child endangement by purposely, knowingly, or negligently causing substantial risk of death or serious bodily injury to a child under 14 years of age by operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol or dangerous drugs in violation of § 61-8-401 with a child in the vehicle.

 COUNT II: On or about the 20th day of February, 2015, the above-named Defendant operated a vehicle, a Dodge Caliber, in willful or wanton disregard for the safety of persons or property, to wit: driving in a manner in which she almost hit a house, drove on the sidewalk, and hit two parked cars before stopping and having the keys removed from her by a bystander.

COUNT III: On or about the 20th day of February, 2015, the above-named Defendant committed the offense of driving or being in actual physical control of a motor vehicle, a Dodge Caliber upon a way of this state open to the public, Margaret Street and Strand Avenue in Missoula County, while under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs, a third offense.

MATT JENNINGS, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of Ana Cristina Perez for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about the 20th day of February, 2015, at approximately 1929 hours, Missoula City Police officers were alerted by dispatch to moving violations occurring in the area of Margaret Street and Strand Avenue in the City of Missoula. One caller reported seeing a silver Dodge Caliber almost hit a house, drive on the sidewalk, and hit two parked cars before stopping. A second witness observed similar driving and attempted to block the Caliber in by parking his truck in front of the car. The second witness ultimately reached into the Caliber after it stopped and pulled the keys from the ignition. The second witness also reported there was a small child in the vehicle.

Missoula Police officers Kamerer, Woods, and Potter reported to the scene.

Officer Kamerer made contact with the driver of the Caliber who was later identified as Ana Perez, the Defendant. Officer Kamerer observed that the Defendant had slurred speech, squinted bloodshot eyes, and had an extremely difficult time speaking with him. The Defendant had a significant difficulty finding her license or other identification even though Officer Kamerer could clearly see her Passport in her purse and directly asked her for her Passport. Officer Kamerer obtained her purse with her consent and found her license and Passport in it. During this entire encounter, the Defendant was in the vehicle and her four year old daughter was on her lap, upset and crying.

Officer Kamerer also spoke to the original complainant at the scene. The Complainant first saw the Defendant's vehicle traveling East on South Avenue, and observed is swerving back and forth. The complainant followed the Defendant's vehicle. The first complainant saw the Defendant's vehicle take an extremely wide left turn at an intersection and drove up onto the curb in the process, and that the Defendant had failed to yield to oncoming traffic when making the left turn. The Complainant described the driving as "crazy," and that the Defendant continued to swerve, speed up and then slam on the brakes, and ultimately struck a car on Burlington Street before stopping in a parking lot. The complainant yelled for the Defendant to turn her car off and an argument ensued. It was at this point that the second complainant blocked her vehicle to keep it from leaving the scene.

Officer Kamerer observed significant damage to the front passenger side quarter panel of the Defendant's vehicle.

Officer Woods interviewed the second complainant who reported observations similar to the first complainant. He saw the Defendant's vehicle drive onto the curb, saw it almost crash into another car, and strike a parked Ford truck. The second Complainant reported that the Defendant refused to shut off her car so blocked her vehicle, reached in her car, put the car in park, and took the keys.

Officer Potter also observed when he arrived at the scene the Defendant was in her vehicle holding her child in her lap. Officer Potter reported that the Defendant had a dazed expression on her face and could barely open her eyes, which were red and glassy. Officer Potter observed that the Defendant's speech was slurred and her motor skills were delayed. He observed a sharp odor from the vehicle, but could not identify it. The Defendant admitted to Officer Potter that she had consumed alcohol. Officer Potter performed SFTS on the Defendant who exhibited 6 of 6 indicators on the HGN test, but he could not perform other tests because the Defendant was too intoxicated to follow his instructions. The Defendant refused to provide a breath sample. After officers obtained a warrant, a blood sample was taken and the Defendant was taken to Missoula County Detention Facility.
