**COMPLAINT** 

SHAWN THOMAS, Deputy Missoula County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 29<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2015, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of COUNT I: CRIMINAL ENDANGERMENT, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-207, punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine; COUNT II: CRIMINAL ENDANGERMENT, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-207, punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine: COUNT III: CRIMINAL ENDANGERMENT, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-207, punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine; COUNT IV: FLEEING FROM OR ELUDING A PEACE OFFICER, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 61-8-316(1) and (2)(a), punishable by 1 year MCJ and/or \$2,000 fine; COUNT V: RECKLESS DRIVING, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely. Mont. Code Ann. 61-8-301(1)(a), punishable by 90 days MCDF and/or \$25-\$300 fine and COUNT VI: DRIVING A MOTOR VEHICLE WHILE UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL OR DRUGS - 4TH OFFENSE, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 61-8-401(1)(a)[4th+], punishable by 13 months DOC & not more than 5 years DOC or MSP suspended and \$1,000-\$10,000 fine. If prior

vehicle and such Defendant knowingly failed to obey such signal by increasing the speed of her motor vehicle, continuing at a speed that was 10 or more mph above the applicable speed limit or otherwise fleeing from, eluding or attempting to flee from or elude the peace officer.

COUNT V: On or about January 29, 2015, the above-named Defendant operated a vehicle, a 2000 Chevrolet Malibu, in willful or wanton disregard for the safety of persons or property, by nearly colliding with other motor vehicles, including a school bus, and or pedestrians.

COUNT VI: On or about January 29, 2015, the above-named Defendant drove or was in actual physical control of a motor vehicle, a 2000 Chevrolet Malibu, upon ways of this state open to the public including Pine, Spruce, Higgins, Orange, Owen, Alder, Railroad, Patte and or Main Streets in the City of Missoula, while under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs, a fourth or subsequent offense.

COUNT I: On or about January 29, 2015, the above-named Defendant knowingly engaged in conduct that created a substantial risk of death or serious bodily injury to "DPC" by consuming alcohol and or prescription drugs, eluding pursuing officers at a high rate of speed and or driving the wrong way on Main Street crashing her 2000 Chevrolet Malibu into a Jeep SUV he was driving.

COUNT II: On or about January 29, 2015, the above-named Defendant knowingly engaged in conduct that created a substantial risk of death or serious bodily injury to nine year old "KC" by consuming alcohol and or prescription drugs, eluding pursuing officers at a high rate of speed and or driving the wrong way on Main Street crashing her 2000 Chevrolet Malibu into a Jeep SUV in which he was a passenger.

COUNT III: On or about January 29, 2015, the above-named Defendant knowingly engaged in conduct that created a substantial risk of death or serious bodily injury to seven year old "VC" by consuming alcohol and or prescription drugs, eluding pursuing officers at a high rate of speed and or driving the wrong way on Main Street crashing her 2000 Chevrolet Malibu into a Jeep SUV in which she was a passenger.

COUNT IV: On or about January 29, 2015, the above-named Defendant, while operating a 2000 Chevrolet Malibu automobile, fled from or eluded a uniformed peace officer, Missoula Police Sergeant J. C. Denton, operating a police vehicle in the lawful performance of such officer's duties who gave the Defendant a visual or audible signal by hand, voice, emergency light or siren directing the Defendant to stop the motor

AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

S. THOMAS, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of CAROL ANN BURRAFATO for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

At approximately 2 PM on January 29, 2014 the Missoula 911 Center began receiving multiple calls of a white car being driven recklessly, by an apparently impaired driver, in downtown Missoula on Orange, Spruce, Pine, Higgins, Pattee and Main Streets.

Officers of the Missoula Police Department responded and observed the car, a 2000 Chevrolet Malibu, nearly strike a yellow school bus turning North onto Orange Street. The suspect car turned north onto Owen with officers in pursuit. The car failed to vield to the lights or sirens activated on marked patrol cars and increased its speed to

 an estimated 40 miles per hour going past two stop signs without stopping and nearly striking another vehicle.

Eventually the car turned the wrong way on Main Street - driving east in lanes of traffic assigned exclusively to westbound vehicles - and collided with a westbound Jeep SUV occupied by an adult driver and two minor children. The driver of the Jeep told officers that as he swerved trying unsuccessfully to avoid a head on collision he thought, "Why are you trying to kill me?"

The white Malibu spun the Jeep 180 degrees and then careened into a parked and unoccupied Suburban. All three vehicles sustained major damage with the front ends of both the Jeep and the Malibu having extensive disabling damage.

The occupants of the Jeep, who were all wearing seat belts, were visibly shaken and upset. They were examined by emergency medical personnel and released. The driver and sole occupant of the white Malibu, identified as Carol Ann Burrafato, was transported to St. Patrick Hospital for treatment of apparent ankle or leg injuries. At the hospital a sample of her blood was drawn pursuant to the Montana implied consent law. It has been sent to the State Crime Lab for toxicology analysis.

Medical personal at the crash scene recovered two bottles of prescription medication from inside Ms. Burrafato's Mailbu. One of them is a pain reliever which, according to Drugs.com, when mixed with alcohol, can impair thinking and reactions. On the morning after the crash, Ms. Buffato was interviewed by officers at the hospital. She denied any memory of the crash but admitted having consumed alcohol prior to the incident.

Subsequent to the crash, the Montana Highway Patrol was notified that minutes before the incident on Main Street, the same suspect vehicle had struck two other cars near the intersection of Pine and Higgins. The driver of the first vehicle reported that after the white car hit him from behind, he got out and approached the female driver who cursed at him. She then backed up, hit a second car, then pulled forward, again striking the first car, before driving from the scene at a high rate of speed. The drivers of

both hit vehicles report the woman driving the white car appeared intoxicated and nearly struck a pedestrian in a nearby crosswalk as she left the area.

Carol Ann Burrafato's Montana Driver's history indicates that since April of 2012 she has been a Revoked Habitual Traffic Offender whose driving privileges are suspended. That history also shows she was convicted of Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol in 2010 and 2012 and of Operating A Motor Vehicle with a BAC of 0.08 or Greater in 2011.
