COMPLAINT



ANDREW W. PAUL, Deputy County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 16<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2015, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of:

COUNT II: AGGRAVATED BURGLARY, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-6-204(2), punishable by 40 years MSP and a \$50,000 fine; COUNT III: ASSAULT WITH WEAPON, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-213, punishable by 20 years MSP and a \$50,000 fine; and COUNT IIII: CRIMINAL MISCHIEF, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-6-101(1)[1], punishable by 6 months MCDF and a \$1,500 fine.

The facts constituting the offense are:

**COUNT I:** On or about the 16th day of March, 2015, the above-named Defendant knowingly entered or remained unlawfully in an occupied structure with the purpose to commit an offense therein and in effecting entry or in the course of committing the offense, the Defendant purposely, knowingly, or negligently inflicted bodily injury upon Druard Archer.

COUNT II: On or about the 16th day of March, 2015, the above-named Defendant purposely or knowingly caused bodily injury to Druard Archer with a weapon, specifically: the Defendant struck Druard Archer in the head with a tire iron.

COUNT III: On or about the 16th day of March, 2015, the above-named Defendant committed the offense of criminal mischief by knowingly or purposely damaging or destroying a glass door, the property of University of Montana Student Housing, without consent.

ANDREW W. PAUL, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of JESSIP DENNIS AKAU for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about the 16<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2015, at about 2:10 a.m., UM Police responded to UM Student Housing for a report of broken glass. When officers arrived at the residence they found that the sliding glass back door had been broken out, enough to allow a person ingress or egress. Officers went inside and found Duard Archer at the top of the stairs, moaning and in a great deal of pain. Archer had been struck in the head multiple times, was bleeding profusely and was missing a large piece of his ear. When asked who had attacked him, Archer said, "Jessip." Archer was conscious but was having difficulty explaining what happened. Archer lost consciousness while

medical personnel attended to him. Archer was transported to the hospital. There, he was diagnosed with an orbital fracture, broken jaw, partially severed ear and possible brain bleed.

Detective Merifield and Detective Franke met with Archer at the hospital. He identified his attacker as Jessip Akau (Defendant). Archer remembered that there was a lot of yelling and that he got smashed and stomped. Archer said that Defendant was a friend of Archer's ex-girlfriend Shella. He said that Defendant did not have permission to enter his residence.

Detectives then went to Defendant's place of work and located Defendant there. Defendant knew why they were and agreed to go with detectives to give a statement. Defendant said that she knew Archer because he used to date Defendant's friend Shella. Defendant said that Archer had been messing with Shella since the break-up, several months ago. On the night of March 15, 2015, Defendant said that Shella called and asked the Defendant to come to a local bar. Defendant went to the bar but did not find Shella. Defendant knew someone at the bar and stayed. Defendant said the bartender told Defendant that Archer had slashed her tire. Defendant went out and found one tire had been slashed. Defendant stayed until bar closing, went home to change clothes, put on black rubber gloves, went back to her car and pulled out the tire iron.

Defendant went to Archer's residence and started pounding on the door with the tire iron. Defendant attempted to kick the door in, three times, but was unsuccessful. Defendant said that Archer eventually opened the door and Defendant pushed Archer back inside the residence and got in his face – accusing him of slashing her tires.

Archer denied slashing the tires and had no knowledge about how the tires had been cut. Defendant said that Archer then turned and went upstairs to his bedroom.

Defendant ran up the stairs after him.

Archer was sitting on his bed and Defendant was standing in front of him with the tire iron in hand. Archer again denied slashing Defendant's tires. This infuriated Defendant because it seemed that Archer wasn't being honest and taking responsibility for what he had done. Defendant said that she hit Archer in the face with the tire iron, twice. Archer said, "Please stop." Defendant stopped and left the room. Defendant couldn't get out the front door because it was jammed. Defendant was freaking out. Defendant then went to the sliding glass back door and smashed out the glass in order to leave the residence.

When asked why Defendant struck Archer in the head with a tire iron, Defendant said that she was really angry and wanted to get back at him somehow. Defendant said that Archer is always doing "sneaky stuff" and that she wanted him to know that he has to "respect" her.

The investigation is ongoing.
