#### COMPLAINT

S. THOMAS, Deputy County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 15th day of April, 2015, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of COUNT I: ESCAPE, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-7-306(3)(a), punishable by up to 20 years MSP, OR IN THE ALTERNATIVE, ASSAULT ON A PEACE OR JUDICIAL OFFICER, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-210, punishable by not less than 2 years or more than 10 years MSP and \$50,000 fine.

The facts constituting the offense are:

COUNT I: On or about the 15<sup>th</sup> day of April, 2015, the above-named Defendant knowingly or purposely eluded official detention after having been placed under actual or constructive restraint or custody by a peace officer pursuant to arrest. Defendant escaped by the use or threat of force.

#### OR IN THE ALTERNATIVE:

On or about the 15th day of April, 2015, the above-named Defendant purposely or knowingly caused bodily injury to a peace officer, Missoula City Police Officer Mattix, by kicking Mattix in the face.

**AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE** 

S. THOMAS, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

: SS

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of CHARLES DAVID AMENT for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about April 15, 2015, at approximately 1823 hours, Missoula City Police

Officers Nathan Mattix and Eric Weber responded to 500 North Higgins Avenue in

Missoula, MT. Officers made contact with the complainant, who stated an unknown
male showed up for an anger management meeting, but the complainant told the male
to leave the building because he appeared to be high on drugs. The complaint had
observed white powder in both of the male's nostrils. The complaint resumed the
meeting and saw the male walk by the door two or three times before he went upstairs.
The complaint then called 911 to have law enforcement remove the male from the

building. The complainant provided a description of the male as being bald, slender, white and wearing tan shorts and a green top.

Officers Weber and Mattix went up to the second floor where Officer Weber observed a male in the hallway matching the description provided by the complainant. Weber yelled for the male to stop. Weber asked the male why he didn't leave the building after being told to leave earlier. The male stated that he had to use the bathroom and then said 'ok, I'll leave'. Officer Mattix asked the male for ID and the male said he did not have one. Officer Weber believed the male was under the influence of a drug based on his lack of balance and slow, slurred speech. The male stated his name was "Charlie Edwards" and his date of birth was 4/1/1978. Dispatch ran the name and date of birth and advised it didn't return to anyone. The officers advised the male he could be charged with obstructing a peace officer for providing a false name and/or date of birth. The male insisted the information he provided was correct. Mattix asked the male for his social security number and the male stated 'I don't give that out to anyone, especially cops.'

Mattix grabbed the male's wrist and told him he was under arrest. The male pulled away from Mattix and started to run down the hallway. Mattix put the male on the ground, and he continued to resist. Weber and Mattix yelled commands at the male to quit resisting and place his hands behind his back. After commands for the male to get on his belly, the male tried to get up. Mattix warned the male he would be tased if he did not stop resisting. The male pushed himself off the ground and started to run. Mattix then tackled the male around the waist and both Mattix and the male fell back to the ground. Mattix was holding the male's leg to prevent him from running. Mattix

looked up and saw the male lift up his leg and extend his leg towards him. Mattix's vision went black and he felt pain on the right side of his face. Mattix realized the male had kicked him in the face, which Officer Weber later confirmed is what he observed happen. The kick to Mattix knocked his glasses off his face, and Mattix lost control over the male. Weber attempted to tase the male twice but it had no apparent effect. The officers chased after the male, who exited the building and ran west though the alley behind the building, crossed Higgins Avenue, and continuing running west in the alley behind the Iron Horse Bar. The male then turned south and crossed Spruce Street, ran through the Old Post parking lot, crossed Pine Street, and got to the parking lot behind the Oxford Bar, where Officers Manraska and Harrington were able to corner and apprehend the male. The male again resisted officers efforts to place his hands behind his back and it took four officers to place the male in restraints.

Once at the jail, Detention Officer Craig Mueller recognized the male as Charles David Ament, whose date of birth is not 4/1/1978, which is the date of birth Ament had provided to Officer Mattix and Weber at 500 North Higgins. Officer Mattix viewed a prior booking photo of Ament and confirmed it was the same male who had kicked him in the face and ran away. Ament is currently on felony probation for Possession of Dangerous Drugs with Intent to Distribute.
