COMPLAINT

SUZY BOYLAN, Assistant Chief Criminal County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 8th day of June, 2015, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of COUNT I: AGGRAVATED ANIMAL CRUELTY, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-8-217, punishable by 2 years MSP and/or \$2,500 fine; COUNT II: PARTNER OR FAMILY MEMBER ASSAULT - 1ST OFFENSE, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-206[1st], punishable by not less than 24 hours or more than one year MCDF and/or a fine not less than \$100 or more than \$1000; COUNT III: OBSTRUCTING PEACE OFFICER OR OTHER PUBLIC SERVANT, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-7-302(1), punishable by 6 months MCDF and/or \$500 fine; and COUNT IV: CRIMINAL MISCHIEF, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-6-101(1)[1], punishable by 6 months MCDF and/or \$1,500 fine.

The facts constituting the offense are:

COUNT I: On or about the 8th day of June, 2015, the above-named Defendant purposely or knowingly killed or inflicted cruelty to an animal with the purpose of

terrifying, torturing, or mutilating the animal, a dog, by beating it, causing severe blunt force injuries that required the dog be euthanized.

COUNT II: On or about the 8th day of June, 2015, the above-named Defendant purposely or knowingly caused reasonable apprehension of bodily injury to Jane Doe, a family member, by

COUNT III: On or about the 8th day of June, 2015, the above-named Defendant knowingly obstructed, impaired, or hindered the enforcement of the criminal law, the preservation of the peace, or the performance of a governmental function, including service of process by running from police officers after they instructed him to stop.

COUNT IV: On or about the 8th day of June, 2015, the above-named Defendant committed the offense of criminal mischief by knowingly or purposely injuring, damaging, or destroying the property of Jane Doe, a cabinet, glasses, and other household items.

AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

Cause No. CR-2015-510

SUZY BOYLAN, Assistant Chief Criminal County Attorney, Montana, being first

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of JESSE CARL DURHAM for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about the 8th day of June, 2010, officers responded to a report of a disturbance at the Crestview Apartment. Jane Doe met officers. She was distraught. She and another female reported that the above-named Defendant had beaten her dog and left it in the dumpster. The animal, a 15 year-old German Shepherd, was located in a dumpster. She was still alive but appeared to be seriously injured. There was a visible and bleeding wound to the back of her head. The Animal Control officer who responded reported her neck may have been broken. In Defendant's apartment, which he shared with Jane Doe, a family member, officers noted broken glass through out the apartment,

clothing thrown around the living room, and a cabinet door which had been torn off its hinges.

Jane Doe reported that she believed Defendant had ingested "mushrooms," a hallucinogenic drug. She reported that Defendant called her at work and reported that the dog had stopped breathing and died. She came home and noticed a broken broomstick. She left the apartment with the broomstick and found Defendant on the stairs. He 'got in her face" and she told him to back up. She reported she was afraid of what he would do after what he had done to the dog. She held the broomstick in her hand in case he tried to harm her. She observed that Defendant "wasn't in his right mind." Defendant was slurring his words and speaking aggressively.

Officers located Defendant nearby and told him to stop. He fled, forcing officers to pursue him until he fell and they were able to place him in custody.

The veterinarian who performed an autopsy on the dog reported that the dog came to him in shock from presumed blunt trauma." He found broken skull bones and five small puncture wounds on the back of the neck and ears.

Detective Brueckner interviewed the Defendant, who reported he had some mental health issues and chemical dependency issues. Defendant has PTSD and used alcohol, mushrooms, and cocaine before the incident. Defendant has no memory of the incident before Jane Doe came home from work.
