13	oath, deposes and says:
14	I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of JOE
15	RICHARD KRUGER for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and
1.7	based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists
18	to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying
19	complaint.
20	On November 27, 2015, Missoula County Sheriff's Office deputies responded to
21	a report of a gun being fired near a residence on the 8000 block of Pheasant Drive,
23	Missoula County, MT. Upon arrival, deputies observed the Defendant standing on the
24	front porch of the residence, holding a revovler. Deputies ordered the Defendant to
25	drop the weapon, which he did. The Defendant was then arrested.
26	Deputies contacted Jane Doe, who has been the Defendant's partner for
27	
28	approximately two and a half years. Doe indicated that the Defendant became angry
	with her regarding some household chores that were not complete. In response, the

Defendant walked outside the residence with his .44 magnum revolver, which Doe indicated the Defendant keeps with him at all times. Doe then heard a gunshot. Doe was scared of what the Defendant might do, so she locked the doors to the home. The Defendant attempted to enter the home and was upset that Doe had locked him out. The Defendant yelled at Doe to "open the fucking door" and began counting down ("Five... four... three... two..."). Doe was unsure of what would happen at the end of the countdown, but was afraid the Defendant may attempt to enter the residence and hurt her.

Deputies spoke with another resident of the home, Justin Arney, who confirmed Doe's report to the police. Arney also indicated he was frightened and that he was not sure what the Defendant's intentions were.

Deputies spoke with the Defendant, who admitted to firing the weapon. The

Deputies spoke with the Defendant, who admitted to firing the weapon. The Defendant claimed he did not intend to harm anyone, but could not provide an explanation for why he did what he did.

Deputies observed one empty shell casing in the revolver, along with five live rounds.
