KARLA PAINTER, Deputy County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 13th day of January, 2016, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of COUNT I: CRIMINAL ENDANGERMENT, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-207, punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine; COUNT II: CRIMINAL ENDANGERMENT, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-207, punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine; COUNT III: CRIMINAL ENDANGERMENT, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-207, punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine; COUNT IV: FLEEING FROM OR ELUDING A PEACE OFFICER, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 61-8-316(1) and (2)(a), punishable by 1 year MCDF and/or \$2,000 fine; COUNT V: DISORDERLY CONDUCT, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. COUNT II: On or about the 13th day of January, 2016, the above-named Defendant knowingly engaged in conduct that created a substantial risk of death or serious bodily injury to Officer Andy Roy by driving a vehicle toward him forcing Roy to step out of the way to avoid being hit.

COUNT III: On or about the 13th day of January, 2016, the above-named Defendant knowingly engaged in conduct that created a substantial risk of death or serious bodily injury to a male in a wheelchair by driving a vehicle toward him and nearly striking him.

COUNT IV: On or about the 13th day of January, 2016, the above-named Defendant, while operating a motor vehicle, a Ford Taurus, fled from or eluded a uniformed peace officer, Officer Andy Roy, operating a police vehicle in the lawful performance of his official duties after Officer Roy gave the Defendant visual and audio signals directing the Defendant to stop the motor vehicle and the Defendant knowingly failed to obey such signals by increasing the speed of the motor vehicle.

COUNT V: On or about the 13th day of January, 2016, the above-named Defendant knowingly disturbed the peace by constantly honking her car horn and screaming in the pre-release parking lot.

AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

KARLA PAINTER, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of KATHY ELAINE LAMB for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about January 13, 2016, at approximately 4 p.m., Officer Andy Roy of the Missoula Police Department was exiting the sally port at the Missoula County Detention Facility when Misdemeanor Probation Officer Melissa Thompson frantically ran towards his car. Thompson pointed to a tan-colored Ford Taurus that was driving towards them from the pre-release parking area. Thompson reported the driver of the car, a female later identified as Kathy Lamb, had nearly ran her over and needed to be stopped.

At this point Lamb stopped her vehicle approximately 10-15 feet from Officer

Roy's. Officer-Roy-began-walking-around-the-driver's-side-of-his-patrol-car-while

signaling to Lamb to turn off her engine. Lamb responded by revving the engine and traveling towards Officer Roy. He stepped back behind the driver's side of the patrol car as she drove past. Officer Roy believed Lamb would have struck him if he had not stopped walking towards her.

Officer Roy returned to his patrol car, activated his lights and sirens, and notified 911 he was involved in a pursuit traveling east on Mullan Road. Once Lamb reached the intersection of Mullan and Broadway, she drove around a vehicle stopped at a red light and turned right onto Broadway. She continued east and travelled into the left hand lane at the intersection of Broadway and Russell. Lamb slowed but went through a red light. Traffic was heavy at the time. At one point Lamb approached a male in a wheel chair in the bike lane. Officer Roy saw Lamb come within a car-length of hitting the man before veering to the left and narrowly avoiding him.

Lamb continued eastbound on Broadway traveling at a high rate of speed and entering the center turn lane. Lamb approached the intersection at Broadway and Orange Street and veered into the left hand turn lane but then turned right at a red light. At this point the police department ended the pursuit due to the danger it posed to others downtown. Officer Roy turned off his lights and sirens as he came to the Broadway and Orange Street intersection. However he later observed Lamb's vehicle stopped against the west facing door of the KECI building. Officer Roy drove toward the vehicle and saw Lamb was trying to enter the building. When Lamb saw him she immediately returned to her car. Officer Roy stopped his patrol car in front of hers while Officer Pete Woods parked his patrol car directly behind her. The officers removed Lamb from the vehicle and placed her under arrest.

While Officer Woods transported Lamb to the Missoula County Detention Facility she asked "how many people were chasing me? That is hilarious!" and began to laugh. She then stated, "You guys put my life in danger and that's fucked up." Once they arrived at the jail. Officer Woods spoke with Lieutenant Sheryl Ziegler whom witnessed Lamb almost run over Thompson in the parking lot. Lieutenant Ziegler confirmed Thompson had to run to get out of the way of her Lamb's vehicle.

Officer Roy cleared the scene and met with Thompson whom explained she originally exited her office in the pre-release building because she could hear someone constantly honking a car horn and screaming. Thompson then walked to toward the jail to see if she could discern the problem. As she did so she heard Lamb's vehicle quickly accelerate as it travelled backwards out of the parking spot. Thompson estimated the vehicle was going approximately 18-20 miles per hour. Thompson stated Lamb was coming directly toward her forcing her to jump away and land in a snow bank to avoid being hit. Thompson stated Lamb's vehicle came within about 2 feet of striking her.
