AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

I have read the law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of ROSE SHARON DEROCHE for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports and the personal accounts of law enforcement, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about the 12th day of February, 2016, at approximately 1:49 a.m., Missoula City Police Officers responded to a residence regarding a reported stabbing. Upon arrival, Officers met with the three occupants of the residence—Donald Spottedelk, Dean Littlelight, and Rose DeRoche (Defendant). Spottedelk had been stabbed numerous times in the back and the head and was bleeding profusely. All three individuals were extremely intoxicated.

Spottedelk was transported to the hospital and Littlelight and Defendant were taken to the police station. Upon arrival at the station, Littlelight and Defendant slept for several hours in separate interview rooms.

Meanwhile, Officers obtained a search warrant for the residence. Inside, they discovered a substantial amount of blood in the entry way and smeared across the walls. They also located a knife under the living room couch. The blade was approximately 4-5" long and had a black plastic handle with an apparent blood stain.

Next, Officers went to the hospital to interview Spottedelk, who initially stated that Littlelight was pushing him earlier that morning as he was attempting to leave the residence. He believed that Littlelight had stabbed him at this time; however, he explained that he did not actually realize that he had been stabbed until he awoke at the hospital. Spottedelk was stabbed nine times in the back and twice in the head.

Next, Officers interviewed Defendant, who initially claimed that an unknown individual had stabbed Spottedelk. However, during the course of the interview, she admitted that she was the one who grabbed a knife from the kitchen and "popped" Spottedelk in the back after he approached her. She stated that Littlelight told her to concoct her initial version of events. Defendant and Spottedelk were in a relationship approximately six years prior.

Lastly, Officers interviewed Littlelight who explained that he was attempting to sleep on the couch and overheard arguing. He stated that there were two other people in the apartment—Defendant and Spottedelk. At some point, he was startled by a loud noise and Spottedelk saying that he had been stabbed. Littlelight then left the

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residence to obtain help. Littlelight noted that he was intoxicated at the time of the incident.

Based on the newly discovered events, Officers re-interviewed Spottedelk, who admitted that he had not been entirely truthful about the morning's events. He then provided a number of varying and unclear accounts about what had actually taken place.
