justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

Hebert, Missoula City Police Department, responded to a residence regarding a reported

physical disturbance. Upon arrival, Sergeant Hebert met with Jacob Lohr who stated that

he recently returned home from the store with his girlfriend and infant daughter. At that time, he observed a red Ford Explorer parked along a nearby street. The male driver of the Explorer, later identified as Micah Baldwin (Defendant), briefly left the area. Lohr watched him drive the wrong way down a one way and circle back to Lorh's residence. Defendant then exited the Explorer and walked onto Lohr's property.

Lohr exited his home and met Defendant outside. Defendant pointed at Lohr's girlfriend's car and asked, "Where's John or the person who owns this car?" Defendant mentioned that that car had been following him all day. He also claimed to have run the car's license plate number and learned that it returned to "John." The conversation between Lohr and Defendant began to escalate until it turned physical, with both parties delivering blows.

At some point, Defendant's car alarm went off and he retreated to his Explorer. Lohr told Defendant that he would shoot him if he returned to his property. Lohr then walked back inside his home. As he was closing the door, Lohr looked outside and observed Defendant retrieve a handgun from the Explorer and point it directly at the doorway of his residence. Lohr stated that he was "terrified" for the safety of his girlfriend and child, and later added that he felt threatened and was afraid for his own safety. Lohr described the gun as "square," and thought it might have been a Glock. Lohr stated that Defendant pointed the gun at him from approximately ten yards away. After Lohr closed the door, Defendant got back inside of his Explorer and drove away.

Sergeant Hebert spoke with other witnesses—Raurie Birch, Carleigh O'Brien, and Kale Rife—who were at a neighboring residence. Birch observed Defendant park in front of Lohr's residence and she waved at him. Defendant did not waive back and

 appeared agitated. As the altercation between Lohr and Defendant escalated, Birch, O'Brien, and Rife went inside and looked out the window. Birch and O'Brien said that they observed Defendant walk over to the Explorer, take out a silver automatic gun, and point it at Lohr's residence.

Defendant was described by the parties as having a shaved head and a goatee, and was wearing a black hoodie. Lohr mentioned that Defendant had the number "187" tattooed on the back of his head.

At approximately 10:30 p.m. that evening, Dispatch contacted Sergeant Hebert and advised that a report of suspicious activity had just been made regarding a male driving a red Explorer. Sergeant Hebert and Officer Bilrey responded to the incident location and made contact with Defendant, a male, later identified as Anthony Gonzalo, and a female, later identified as Sara Murray. Sergeant Hebert noticed that Defendant was wearing a black hoodie and had the number "187" tattooed on the back of his head, which was also shaved. Sergeant Hebert did not observe a handgun in Defendant's possession.

Murray stated that she just arrived in Missoula from Butte and had only been in contact with Defendant for a short time. Gonzalo stated that he purchased the Explorer two days earlier and allowed Defendant to drive it that afternoon. Gonzalo explained that he, Murray, and another male recently picked Defendant up at his "baby-momma's" trailer. Defendant did not have the Explorer at the trailer at that time because he left it at the parties' current location. When they arrived to get the Explorer, Defendant could not find the keys. Gonzalo stated that there might be rifles in the Explorer and explained that he owns a silver competition .22 caliber gun as well as a 1911 frame .22

caliber gun. He stated that he believed these guns were at his residence, but admitted that Defendant could have gained access to them earlier in the day. Gonzalo refused to allow officers to search the Explorer.

Meanwhile, Defendant appeared very fidgety and was sweating. When asked about the incident with Lohr, Defendant turned away from Sergeant Hebert, put his hands on his head, and refused to answer any questions. Defendant was then arrested and taken to jail. He was uncooperative with staff and had to be put in to a maximum security cell.

Gonzalo subsequently told Sergeant Hebert that he believed his girlfriend would be able to locate the two .22 caliber guns at their residence. Sergeant Hebert responded to their address and spoke with Lexi Virja, Gonzalo's girlfriend. Virja was not able to find the silver competition .22 caliber gun, but did locate a black pellet gun.
