COMPLAINT

JASON MARKS, Chief Deputy County Attorney, and BRIAN LOWNEY, Deputy County Attorney, depose and say that on or about the 30th day of March, 2016, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offense of COUNT I: DELIBERATE HOMICIDE, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-102[1]. punishable by life imprisonment or not less than 10 or more than 100 years MSP.

The facts constituting the offense are:

COUNT I: On or about the 30th day of March, 2016, the above-named Defendant purposely or knowingly committed a forcible felony, Assault on a Minor, by purposely or knowingly causing bodily injury to Brayden Beal, an infant, and in the course of the forcible felony the Defendant caused the death of another human being, Brayden Beal.

AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

JASON MARKS, Chief Deputy Missoula County Attorney and BRIAN LOWNEY,

Deputy Missoula County Attorney, being first duly sworn upon oath, depose and say:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of MARC PALMER for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about the 30<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2016, shortly before 8:00 a.m., law enforcement and medical personnel responded to 1839 Sherwood Street in Missoula

after 911 received a call reporting that there was an infant at that address that was not breathing. Upon arrival they were met by Marc Palmer who was holding 5 month old Brayden Beal under the armpits. Brayden was unresponsive. Also present were Brayden's mother, Ginny Peck, and Marc's mother Mary Palmer. Brayden was transported to St. Patrick's Hospital where he was pronounced dead.

Officers and medical personnel noted suspicious bruising around Brayden's mouth and a tear inside his mouth in the area between his upper lip and front teeth.

Missoula City Police began an investigation into Brayden's death. Interviews were conducted with Ginny Peck, Marc Palmer, and Mary Palmer. The residence was searched and baby wipes, with what appeared to be blood on them, were found in in the trash. There was also what appeared to be blood on a pair of pants that had been used for padding in Brayden's car seat.

Detectives learned that Ginny and Marc, who is not the father of Brayden, had been staying with Mary in her trailer at 1839 Sherwood. The trailer only has one bedroom so Ginny and Marc had been sleeping on a futon in the front room and Brayden had been sleeping in his car seat on the floor near the futon. Everyone agreed that Brayden was alive when they went to bed on the very early morning hours of March 30, 2016, and did not have injuries to his mouth. It was also clear from the interviews that the bloody baby wipes had not been in the trash and the pants in Brayden's car seat had been recently washed.

Ginny told detectives that she went to sleep approximately 1:00 a.m. and that Brayden was seemingly fine at that time. She said she woke sometime around 2:00 a.m. and heard Marc saying "knock it off Brayden" and she could hear Brayden fussing.

She said she asked Marc if he wanted her to take over but he told her "I got this." She said he was over Brayden's car seat and she heard what she thought was the sound of the car seat rocking back and forth. She said the next time she woke up it was around 7:30 and Marc was telling her that Brayden was not breathing.

Marc was interviewed and told detectives that Brayden had been alive when he went to sleep with Ginny at approximately 1:00 a.m. on the morning of March 30, 2016. He initially claimed that he had slept the whole night and awoke at 7:30 a.m. to find Brayden unresponsive. When asked about the bloody baby wipes, he said that he woke up between 2:00 and 2:30 a.m. with a bloody nose. He said he used the wipes to clean the blood off of his face and went back to sleep.

An autopsy on Brayden was performed at the Montana State Crime lab. The autopsy confirmed bruising under Brayden's nose and around his mouth as well as the tear inside of the upper lip. There was also bruising discovered on the back of his heard that could be consistent with the back of his head being pressed against a hard object. The medical examiner determined that the cause of death was asphyxia by smothering.

On June 28, 2016, the Montana State Crime Lab completed DNA analysis of the bloody baby wipes that Marc Palmer had told detectives had come from Marc's bloody nose. The blood was in fact a DNA match to Brayden. One of the baby wipes had a second minor source of DNA that could be from Marc Palmer, however, that could not be determined conclusively.
