COMPLAINT

KARLA PAINTER, Deputy County Attorney, deposes and says that from approximately May 3, 2016 to May 10, 2016, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of COUNT I: FORGERY BY COMMON SCHEME, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-6-325(4), punishable by 20 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine; COUNT II: THEFT BY COMMON SCHEME- 1ST OFFENSE, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-6-301(1)[1st], punishable by 6 months MCDF and/or \$1,500 fine.

The facts constituting the offenses are:

COUNT I: From approximately May 3, 2016 to May 10, 2016 the above-named Defendant when, with the purpose to defraud, knowingly without authority altered

checks apparently capable of being used to defraud others in the manner that they
purported to have been with different provisions. The forgeries were committed as part
of a common scheme.
COUNT II: From approximately May 3, 2016 to May 10, 2016, the above-named
Defendant purposely or knowingly obtained or exerted unauthorized control over money
owned by Bonnie Godbout and Emily Hightower with the purpose of depriving the
owners of the property. The thefts were committed as part of a common scheme.

KARLA PAINTER, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of SHAWN LEE EVANS for allegedly committing the offenses set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about May 6, 2016, Bonnie Godbout met with Nadene Hegman from the Missoula County Sheriff's Office and reported that she believed checks had been stolen from her mailbox. Godbout provided her checkbook ledger which showed she had written check # 6344 to Northwestern Energy in the amount of \$156.80. Godbout stated she then placed the check in her mailbox on Speedway Avenue. She provided a copy of the check that was cashed at US Bank on May 4, 2016, which reflected an altered amount of \$556.00 and was made out to Anthony Lee. Tiffany Hastings, a manager at US Bank, notified Godbout that a male had attempted to cash a second check on May 5 in the amount of \$500.00 but, due to the suspicious circumstances, US Bank declined to honor it. Godbout stated she had written that check (# 6345) in the amount of \$18.00 to McGowan Water. Godbout mailed a third check (# 6346) that day in the amount of \$128.09 to Charter Communications. She contacted Charter days later and learned they had not received her payment. Godbout subsequently closed her account to avoid any further unauthorized transactions. Hegman observed the signature on check # 6344 appeared very similar to a signature Anthony Lee had provided on a Property Release Report on January 4, 2016.

On May 9, 2016, Sergeant Robert Kennedy responded to another residence on Speedway Avenue for a reported theft and forgery. Emily Hightower stated that on May 2, she had paid two bills with checks numbered 1316 and 1317 and placed them in her mailbox. The first was written to CBM in the amount of \$47.00 and the second was to Missoula Animal Control in the amount of \$21.00. When Hightower reviewed the payments online, she discovered one of the checks was altered to be payable to Anthony Lee in the amount of \$200.00 and the other was made out to Outback

 Steakhouse in the amount of \$160.00 on May 3, 2016. Hightower showed Sargent Kennedy the checks which appeared to have been washed. Both Hightower and Sargent Kennedy noted the signatures on the two checks did not appear to match each other.

On May 10, 2016, Detective Kenneth White interviewed Anthony Lee about the checks. After waiving his Miranda rights, Lee stated a man named Shawn Evans had been stealing checks and "cooking" them: washing and drying them to remove the ink. Lee stated Evans would then rewrite them so they could be cashed. Lee indicated he recognized check # 1316 and confirmed that he had signed it. Lee said Evans gave it to him and he cashed it for \$200.00 but Lee claimed that Evans took most of the money to purchase methamphetamine and marijuana. Lee stated he had no knowledge of Check #1317 which was made out to Outback Steakhouse. As to # 6344, Lee said Evans washed the check, rewrote it, and gave it to Lee and instructed him to cash it, which Lee did for \$556.00. Lee initially stated Shawn let Lee keep the money, however he later claimed Shawn actually took the cash to buy drugs. Lee said Evans had also been using the checkbook and identification card of a deceased male to pass his other checks all around Missoula.

On May 11, Detective White went to Outback Steakhouse and spoke with Eden Roberts, the server that received check # 1317. Roberts stated the check came from a party consisting of a male and female. He described the male as having short almost shaved hair and tattoos. Roberts explained he remembered the man well because he asked for whiskey with six ice cubes and had left him a \$30.00 tip. Roberts said he saw the male pull the checkbook out of his pocket. Detective White provided Roberts with a

1	photograph lineup including six males. Roberts immediately identified Evans and stated
2	he was "very confident" that was the male he had served.
