AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

RYAN MICKELSON, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of JAMISON DANIEL RICHMOND for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about July 5, 2017, at approximately 7:15 a.m., Jane Doe called 911 to report that her estranged husband, Jamison Richmond, had broken into her

house and threatened her and her ex-husband, John Doe, with a gun. Jane Doe reported Jamison fired the gun and left the house. Jane Doe advised she last saw Jamison walking up the driveway and had heard one gun shot fired outside of the residence. Jane Doe reported that Jamison may be driving a blue Mercury Marquis passenger car, which still had her name on the title.

Deputy Holchhalter, Sgt. Peterson, Detective Volinkaty, and Detective Johnston, among others, all responded to the call. Upon arrival, Deputy Hochhalter made contact with both Jane Doe and John Doe and took recorded statements from each in turn.

Deputy Holchhalter first spoke with Jane Doe. She advised that her estranged husband, Jamison Richmond, who is also the respondent in an order of protection she has, entered her home and went into her bedroom where she and John Doe were lying in bed. Jane Doe stated Jamison was screaming "you ruined my life." She indicated that she got out of bed and approached Jamison. She said he hit her in the forehead with a revolver he was holding. Jamison then pointed the revolver at Jane Doe's chest and pulled the trigger. The weapon did not fire. At that point in time, Jamison pointed the handgun at John Doe. John Doe pulled the bedsheet up to hide himself. Jane Doe threw her hands up, knocking Jamison's hands up as he was firing the weapon, causing it to discharge into the ceiling above the bed. Jamison then walked out of the house. Jane Doe said the gun, according to John Doe, was a black .38 caliber "long nose" revolver. Deputy Holchhalter asked her if she was afraid of Jamison. She

stated "now I am, he tried to f----- kill me." She said "before, I was like really, but then he fired the gun."

Deputy Holchalter thereafter interviewed John Doe. John Doe advised that he woke up when Jamison was at the door. He said that Jamison was pointing the gun at him and Jane Doe while screaming. John Doe stated Jane Doe stood up and approached Jamison, and at that point Jamison pointed the pistol at her chest and pulled the trigger. John Doe stated he heard the "click" and believed that the gun was not loaded. John Doe stated as he was starting to get up, Jane Doe grabbed Jamison's arms and pushed his arm up as Jamison fired the gun into the ceiling. John Doe said Jamison left the house. John Doe stated he checked his body for any gunshot wounds and noted he was in shock.

John Doe said he believed Jamison was trying to kill them. John Doe stated he heard the gun click, saw Jamison strike Jane Doe in the forehead with the muzzle and saw Jamison fire the gun into the ceiling. Deputy Hochhalter asked John Doe if he was fearful of Jamison and his actions. John Doe stated "yeah, he tried to kill us both" and "I'm a dead man walking." Deputy Hochhalter ended the interview with John Doe.

At that time, Detectives Voloinkaty and Johnston located an apparent bullet hole in the ceiling just above the bed where the parties had described it. It appeared to be roughly the correct size consistent with a .38 caliber projectile.

Detective Johnston located the attic access and he and Detective Volinkaty entered the attic to search for the bullet. In the south east corner of the attic they

located where the bullet had exited the sheetrock of the ceiling, however, they were unable to locate the bullet. Using trajectory rods they photographed the bullets path from the bed room into the ceiling, through the ceiling and insulation and to where it struck the roof sheathing. This trajectory path appeared to be consistent with being fired at a low angle from the northwest corner of the bedroom between the door and entrance to the master bath. Eventually, law enforcement cleared the scene.

On July 10, 2017, John Doe responded to the court house and wished to provide additional information to Detective Johnston. John Doe reported that he was not initially planning on staying at the Appaloosa address. Jane Doe pressed John Doe and convinced him to stay with her in Frenchtown. John Doe said that Jane Doe told him that Jamison had been coming out to the house and had been stealing things and was also abusive towards her. John Doe made the comment to Jane Doe that he would "smoke him" if he showed up aggressively while John Doe was there with his kids.

On the morning of the July 5, around 7 a.m., he indicated that Jamison entered the house. John Doe said that when Jamison entered the house that morning, Jamison walked up to him, pointed the gun at him and asked if John Doe was going to smoke him. He noted that Jamison attempted to shoot both he and Jane Doe. John Doe also noted that Jane Doe was actively trying to push Jamison out of the room when Jamison was looking past her and attempted to shoot him. John Doe pulled the sheet up and over himself attempted to conceal

his location, hoping that Jamison would be unable to hit him. John Doe heard the gun fire, and saw that Jamison's hands were being pushed by Jane Doe in their struggle. When Jamison left, Jane Doe followed him out and he went to check on the children in the house.

A.T., Jane Doe's child, also met with Detective Johnston on July 10, 2017. He noted that on that on the day prior, Jamison was at his and Jane Doe's house in violation of the order of protection. Around that time, Jane Doe also called and reported that Jamison showed up to the house on the evening of July 9, 2017. Jane Doe advised she subsequently let him into her home in hopes to settle him down. She said that shortly after A.T. arrived. A.T. saw Jamison was present, and got upset and left the residence. She also reported that when Jamison was at the house he advised her that he got rid of the gun. When discussing the restraining order she indicated that it was issued months ago and that Jamison had previously been served with the order.
