MR. ZENNAMO: Yes, your Honor.

THE COURT: Mr. Blunt, there is an order of protection that I've signed and you've signed. The order tells you that for the next year stay away from , don't call, don't write, text message, no communication.

You're standing there with a grin that I would love to get off the bunch and slap off your face. Why

are you doing that?

THE DEFENDANT: Huh.

THE COURT: Huh? You're standing there grinning at me, smirking at me. What's that all about?

THE DEFENDANT: I'm just laughing. It's okay.

THE COURT: What are you laughing about?
You're in a courtroom, handcuffed, in an orange
jumpsuit being issued an order of protection, and
you're laughing. That's a funny thing, that's
hilarious. How about 30 days in jail for contempt,
that's hilarious, too, isn't it? What's wrong with
you? We done smirking?

MR. ZENNAMO: Say yes.

THE COURT: Now we don't want to talk.

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.
