Film Fest at CSU Behavioral Sciences 131

11:00 am Carbon Nation (96 mins)

A documentary about climate change solutions. It is an optimistic discovery of what people are already doing, what we as a nation could be doing, and what the world needs to do to slow down the impending climate crisis.

12:45 pm Food Fight (73 mins)

This is the story of multinational influence on the food system. The first chunk of the film plays like the Cliff's Notes version of Pollan's Omnivore's Dilemma, although it relies as much on Alice Water's pithy analyses as it does on Pollan's. It races at top speed through the history of subsidies and the effect of artificially cheap commodities on America's waistline and public health.

2:10 pm Growth Busters (98 mins)

This documentary flips our world upside down to see what makes it tick, as it explores the most critical question of our time: How do we become a sustainable civilization?

4:00 pm I Am (76 mins)

I AM is an utterly engaging and entertaining non-fiction film that poses two practical and provocative questions: what's wrong with our world, and what can we do to make it better?

5:25 pm **DIRT!** (81 mins)

This movie takes you inside the wonders of the soil. It tells the story of Earth's most valuable and under appreciated source of fertility—from its miraculous beginning to its crippling degradation.

7:00 pm No Impact Man (90 mins)

Author Colin Beavan began the No Impact Project in Nov. 2006. A newly selfproclaimed environmentalist who could no longer avoid pointing the finger at himself, Colin leaves behind his liberal complacency with a vow to make as little environmental impact as possible for one year... no problem.

8:40 pm Sea Change (86 mins)

This movie is about the effect humans have on the ocean and the environments that are found living in it.
