Buy your license today! Caring for Maine's Outdoor Future **LICENSES:** Hunting license is required. The archery license allows bow and arrow hunting for all legal game throughout the year (except deer during the muzzleloading season). An archery license is **required** to hunt deer during the regular archery and expanded archery seasons.

A muzzleloading license is required, in addition to a hunting license, to hunt deer during muzzleloading season on deer.

A bear permit is required in addition to a hunting license from August 31 through October 30, 2015. Nonresident and alien hunters are required to purchase a November (late season) bear hunting permit to hunt bear during the firearm season on deer if they do not already possess a regular bear hunting permit. See hunting law booklet for other recent changes.

LEGAL HUNTING HOURS:

Animals: 1/2 hour before sunrise to 1/2 hour after sunset. Exceptions: Migratory game birds, raccoons, and coyote.

SUNDAY HUNTING: Illegal in Maine.

HUNTER ORANGE: See hunting law book for details.

STAMPS: A State waterfowl permit and federal duck stamp are required for waterfowl hunters age 16 and over. Migratory waterfowl permits are not required to hunt Crow, Woodcock, Common Snipe, Sora & Virginia Rails, and Gallinules. A pheasant permit is required to hunt pheasant in York and Cumberland counties.
