

Over \$37,000 Donated to Laramie County School District #1 through CSF

The Cheyenne Schools Foundation (CSF) announced the recipients of the 2017 Excellence in Education and Student Enrichment grants at the LCSD1 Board of Trustees Meeting held on October 2nd. Classroom teachers in Laramie County School District #1 (LCSD1) will receive \$33,322 for twenty-one grants in fifteen schools. Eight schools will also receive \$4,100 for their participation in the Run for #1 held on September 16th.

Funding for the grants came from local businesses, LCSD1 employees, participants in the *Run for #1* along with generous gifts from the Carlton and Wheeler families. The Run for #1 set a record this year with over 400 participants raising nearly \$9,000. District employees contributed over \$9,000 through their payroll deduction program.

Local businesses that donated \$3,000 or more were Kohls, First Education Federal Credit Union and Taco John's International. Local businesses that donated \$1,000 were McGee, Hearne & Paiz, Hickey & Evans, Blue Cross Blue Shield of Wyoming and Blue Federal Credit Union. Contributions from other local businesses helped fund the record amount of grants for the 2017-2018 school year.

The Cheyenne Schools Foundation was started in 1995 and gives grants directly to classroom teachers in LCSD1 for projects that are beyond the capacity of the school district's budget. To date, CSF has raised over \$600,000 to support district students.
