COMPLAINT

M. SHAUN DONOVAN, Deputy Missoula County Attorney, deposes
and says that on or about the 15 th day of January, 2013, in Missoula County,
Montana, the Defendant committed the offense(s) of COUNT I: CRIMINAL
ENDANGERMENT, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont.
Code Ann. 45-5-207, punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine;
COUNT II: THEFT, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont.
Code Ann. 45-6-301(8), punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine;
COUNT III: FLEEING FROM OR ELUDING A PEACE OFFICER, a High
Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 61-8-
316(2)(a), punishable by 1 year MCJ and/or \$2,000 fine; COUNT IV:
FLEEING FROM OR ELUDING A PEACE OFFICER, a High Misdemeanor,
in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 61-8-316(2)(a),
punishable by 1 year MCJ and/or \$2,000 fine; COUNT V: FLEEING FROM
OR ELUDING A PEACE OFFICER, a High Misdemeanor, in violation of

Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 61-8-316(2)(a), punishable by 1 year MCJ and/or \$2,000 fine and COUNT VI: HABITUAL TRAFFIC OFFENDER OPERATING A MOTOR VEHICLE, a High Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 61-11-213, punishable by 14 days to 1 year MCDF and/or \$1000 fine.

The facts constituting the offense are:

COUNT I: CRIMINAL ENDANGERMENT

On or about the 15th day of January, 2013, the above-named

Defendant knowingly engaged in conduct that created a substantial risk of death or serious bodily injury to other motorists, pedestrians or individuals on or near Montana Highway 200 from approximately the Clearwater

Junction through Bonner, Interstate Highway 90 from Bonner to Missoula, and or Orange, Toole, Broadway, Russell, Wyoming and or Curtis Streets in the City of Missoula, by driving a 1996 Nissan automobile at excessive rates of speed, pulling into the oncoming lane of traffic to pass, and

eventually colliding with an automobile driven by another motorist.

COUNT II: THEFT

On or about the 15th day of January, 2013, the above-named
Defendant purposely or knowingly exerted unauthorized control over a
1996 Nissan Maxima automobile owned by Phillip and Heidi Stubbs, which
had a value of more than \$1,500, and used, concealed, or abandoned said
vehicle in a manner that deprived the owners of the property;

COUNT III: FLEEING FROM OR ELUDING A PEACE OFFICER
(Montana Highway Patrol Troopers)

On or about the 15th day of January, 2012 the above-named

Defendant Defendant, while operating a motor vehicle, specifically a 1996

Nissan Maxima automobile, on Montana highway 200, fled from or eluded one or more uniformed peace officers of the Montana Highway Patrol, who were operating one or more marked police vehicles in the lawful performance of their duties and who gave the Defendant visual or audible signals by hand, voice, emergency light or siren directing the Defendant to stop his motor vehicle and such Defendant knowingly failed to obey such signals by increasing the speed of his motor vehicle and or continuing at a speed that was 10 or more mph above the applicable speed limit or

otherwise fleeing from, eluding or attempting to flee from or elude said peace officers.

COUNT IV: FLEEING FROM OR ELUDING A PEACE OFFICER
(Missoula County Deputy Sheriff)

On or about the 15th day of January, 2012 the above-named

Defendant Defendant, while operating a motor vehicle, specifically a 1996

Nissan Maxima automobile, on Montana highway 200 in and near Bonner,

Montana, fled from or eluded Missoula County Deputy Sheriff Kenneth

White, a uniformed peace officer, who was operating a marked police

vehicle in the lawful performance of their duties and who gave the

Defendant visual or audible signals by hand, voice, emergency light or

siren directing the Defendant to stop his motor vehicle and such Defendant

knowingly failed to obey such signals by increasing the speed of his motor

vehicle and or continuing at a speed that was 10 or more mph above the

applicable speed limit or otherwise fleeing from, eluding or attempting to

COUNT V: FLEEING FROM OR ELUDING A PEACE OFFICER (Missoula Police Officers)

flee from or elude said peace officers.

On or about the 15th day of January, 2012 the above-named Defendant Defendant, while operating a motor vehicle, specifically a 1996 Nissan Maxima automobile, on streets in the City of Missoula including Orange, Toole, Broadway, Russell, Wyoming and or Curtis, fled from or eluded Missoula Police Officers Mark Blood and Katherine Petersen, peace officers, who were operating an unmarked police vehicle in the lawful performance of their duties and who gave the Defendant visual or audible signals by hand, voice, emergency light or siren directing the Defendant to stop his motor vehicle and such Defendant knowingly failed to obey such signals by increasing the speed of his motor vehicle and or continuing at a speed that was 10 or more mph above the applicable speed limit or otherwise fleeing from, eluding or attempting to flee from or elude said peace officers.

COUNT VI: HABITUAL TRAFFIC OFFENDER OPERATING A MOTOR VEHICLE

On or about the 15TH day of January, 2013, the above-named

Defendant, a person who at the time was declared to be a habitual traffic offender, operated a motor vehicle on Montana Highway 200, Interstate

On the morning of January 15, 2013, Officers of the Montana Highway patrol and the Missoula County Sheriff's Department were advised a dark green 1996 Nissan automobile which had eluded officers and run the

complaint.

Missoula at Orange Street.

Cascade County Sheriff off of the road in Great Falls was observed on Highway 200 in Missoula County near the Clearwater Junction. MHP officers gave chase in marked patrol units and attempted to stop the suspect vehicle without success.

A short time later Deputy Sheriff Kenneth White observed a car matching the suspect vehicle's description traveling near the Bonner mill on highway 200. The road was snowy and slushy and the car traveling an estimated 55 to 60 mph in a 45 mph zone. Deputy White activated the emergency lights and siren in his marked patrol unit and gave chase at speeds in excess of 60 miles per hour as the suspect vehicle failed to yield and continued pulling away. At one point it went through the 35 mph school zone and later pulled into the oncoming eastbound lane of traffic where another car in that lane was forced to pull to the side of the road to avoid a head on collision. The suspect car entered Interstate 90 at the Bonner on ramp, eluded Deputy White who was still in pursuit, and was observed near the Van Buren exit traveling an estimated 100 mph and exiting into

The chase was overheard by Missoula Police Detectives Katherine
Petersen and Mark Blood who drove to the Orange Street area in an
unmarked police vehicle. On Toole near Broadway they saw the suspect

car which eventually turned onto Wyoming where the street was snowy and icy. When Officers Blood and Peterson initiated the lights and siren on their car, the suspect drove around a van and pulled away. Approximately four blocks later, on Curtis, the Defendant lost control, slid sideways and hit the back of another motorist's Subaru automobile. As officers approached the suspect vehicle it attempted to drive off but was stuck in the snow. After directions to exit the car and turn it off were ignored, officers drew their weapons, extracted the young male driver from the car and placed him in handcuffs.

Subsequent investigation disclosed the Subaru owner was not injured. The driver of the fleeing Nissan, which was reported stolen from Great Falls early on the 15th, was identified as Michael Nathan Shae McVey. McVey admitted knowing the unmarked car driven by Blood and Petersen was a police vehicle and fleeing from it and that he had been "running from the cops since Great Falls." He stated at times during the various pursuits he drove as fast as 130 mph and admitted it was reckless and he was fortunate not to have hurt himself or anyone else. He also admitted failing to stop for an officer in a black patrol vehicle near Bonner and said he drove through the school zone there at a speed of more than

100 miles per hour. He admitted knowing the Nissan he was driving was

_	stolen saying it was for sale for \$3,700. Mr. McVey's Montana driving				
3	history indicates his driving privileges are revoked and he has been				
4	designated an habitual traffic offender.
