COMPLAINT

M. SHAUN DONOVAN, Deputy Missoula County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 20th day of June, 2013, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of COUNT I: DRIVING A MOTOR VEHICLE WHILE UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL OR DRUGS -4TH OFFENSE, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 61-8-401(1)(a)[4th+], punishable by 13 months DOC & not more than 5 years DOC or MSP suspended and \$1,000-\$10,000 fine. If prior placement at residential treatment facility, the sentence shall be not less than 13 months or more than 5 years DOC and a fine between \$1,000 and \$10,000; COUNT II: DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED OR REVOKED, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 61-5-212(1)(i), punishable by not less than 2 days or more than 6 months MCDF and a \$500 fine; COUNT III: CRIMINAL CHILD ENDANGERMENT, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-628,

punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine; COUNT IV: CRIMINAL CHILD ENDANGERMENT, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-628, punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine; COUNT V: CRIMINAL CHILD ENDANGERMENT, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-628, punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine and COUNT VI: CRIMINAL CHILD ENDANGERMENT, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-628, punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine.

The facts constituting the offenses are:

OR DRUGS- FOURTH OR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE

On or about June 20, 2013, the above-named Defendant drove or was in actual physical control of a motor vehicle, a 1994 Ford Explorer SUV, upon a way of this state open to the public, Montana Highway 93 North and or Montana Highway 10 West, while under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs, a fourth or subsequent offense.

COUNT II: DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED OR REVOKED

On or about the 20th of June, 2013, the above-named Defendant

drove a motor vehicle on Montana Highway 93 North and or Montana

Highway 10 West, at a time when her privilege to do so was suspended or revoked.

COUNT III: CRIMINAL CHILD ENDANGERMENT ("MPS")

On or about June 20, 2013, the above-named Defendant purposely, knowingly or negligently caused substantial risk of death or serious bodily injury to "MPS", a child under 14 years of age, by operating a motor vehicle, a 1994 Ford Explorer, while under the influence of alcohol or dangerous drugs, with said child in the vehicle.

COUNT IV: CRIMINAL CHILD ENDANGERMENT ("OT")

On or about June 20, 2013, the above-named Defendant purposely, knowingly or negligently caused substantial risk of death or serious bodily injury to "OT", a child under 14 years of age, by operating a motor vehicle, a 1994 Ford Explorer, while under the influence of alcohol or dangerous drugs, with said child in the vehicle.

COUNT V: CRIMINAL CHILD ENDANGERMENT ("JD")

On or about June 20, 2013, the above-named Defendant purposely, knowingly or negligently caused substantial risk of death or serious bodily injury to "JD", a child under 14 years of age, by operating a motor vehicle, a 1994 Ford Explorer, while under the influence of alcohol or dangerous drugs, with said child in the vehicle.

COUNT VI: CRIMINAL CHILD ENDANGERMENT ("ACP")

On or about June 20, 2013, the above-named Defendant purposely, knowingly or negligently caused substantial risk of death or serious bodily injury to "ACP", a child under 14 years of age, by operating a motor vehicle, a 1994 Ford Explorer, while under the influence of alcohol or dangerous drugs, with said child in the vehicle.

24	On or about the 20 th day of June, 2013 Missoula County Deputy				
25 26	Sheriff Zachary Sargent observed a maroon 1994 Ford Explorer SUV				
27	traveling on Montana Highway 93 North and Montana Highway 10 West,				
28	bearing a license plate assigned to a 1998 Honda Civic automobile				

 reported stolen in Lake County. The SUV was stopped and the driver identified as Angie A Dobson. There were four passengers in the Explorer, ""MPS," "OT," ""JD" and ""ACP." Each of them is a female child less than 14 years of age.

A check of Ms. Dobson's driving history disclosed her driving privileges have been suspended by the State of Arizona and she has four previous convictions for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol or Drugs in that state.

As officers talked with Ms. Dobson they noticed indicators that she was under the influence of alcohol or drugs including slurred speech, fidgeting, bloodshot eyes and a dry mouth. She admitted ingesting the dangerous drug methamphetamine the day before by smoking it. An open and partially full can of beer was present inside the SUV and a portable breath test confirmed Ms. Dobson had been consuming alcohol. Her scores on the Standard Field Sobriety Tests indicated impairment and Angie Dobson was arrested for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol or Drugs and transported to the Missoula County Detention Facility.

At MCDF Deputy Ross Jessop, a certified Drug Recognition Expert, conducted a DRE evaluation and concluded Ms. Dobson was under the influence of methamphetamine. A sample of the Defendant's blood was

drawn with her consent and has been sent to the Montana State Forensic

Laboratory for toxicology analysis.

Senate Bill 160 passed by the 63rd Montana Legislature and effective

Senate Bill 160 passed by the 63rd Montana Legislature and effective immediately, created the offense of Criminal Child Endangerment and provides in part: "A person commits the offense of criminal child endangerment if the person purposely, knowingly or negligently causes substantial risk of death or serious bodily injury to a child under 14 year of age by ... operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol or dangerous drugs with a child in the vehicle." According to the Legislative Services Division, Senate Bill 160 will be codified as Section 45-5-628 in the 2013 edition of the Montana Code Annotated.
