JASON MARKS, Assistant Chief Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of RICHARD PAUL STURGEON for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint in and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about the 25th day of November, 2013, Officer Suazo of the Missoula City Police Department went to 3760 N. Reserve in Missoula to

investigate a reported road rage incident involving a handgun. Upon arrival he spoke with Barton Rouns who had made the report to law enforcement.

Rouns reported that as he was driving northbound on Reserve Street on his way to work he was behind a white pick-up truck. He said that the pick-up applied its brakes suddenly at one point but that he didn't think anything of it. When he arrived at his workplace he went to the lot in the rear. At that point he saw that the white pick-up had also pulled around to the rear. Rouns recognized the pick-up as belonging to an individual that had followed him home at one point in the spring to express unhappiness with his driving.

Rouns said he approached the pick-up and, seeing that the driver's side door was open, called out that he was sorry if he had been following too closely. The driver pointed a black gun at Rouns and state "One more time. I'm going to kill you" and then "every God damn day." The driver then got into his pick-up and left. Rouns indicated that he was afraid when the gun was pointed at him. He gave Officer Suazo a general idea of where he thought the driver of the pick-up worked and a license plate number.

Officer Jones searched the indicated area and found the pick-up described by Rounds. There was a black handgun on the dashboard.

1	Officer Jones made contact with the owner of the pick-up, Richard	
3	Sturgeon. Sturgeon admitted that he had followed another driver to a	
4	business on North Reserve and confronted him about tailgating. He	
5	indicated that the man had tailgated him before and that he was very angry	
7	about it. He denied brandishing the handgun and said that the man,	
8	Rouns, must have seen it on the dashboard.
