JORDAN KILBY, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of RONALD J PAGEL for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint in and based upon the information contained in the reports and statements, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

Shenandoah Roath (Roath) stated on or about the 26th day of October, 2013 Roath, was walking her dog in the upper Pattee Canyon recreation area near the Frisbee golf course in Missoula County. Her

 golden retriever was not on a leash. As she approached the picnic area, with her dog out in front of her, she heard a man, later identified as Ronald Pagel, tell her to call her dog. She could not see Pagel at first because he was wearing a green jacket and blended in with the trees.

Roath called for her dog, but he did not respond. When Roath's dog came within five feet of Pagel, Pagel pepper-sprayed the dog in the face. Roath stated she was shocked and yelled, "Did you just pepper spray my dog?" Roath stated that Pagel, who was completely calm, answered, "Yes I did." She then went up to Pagel and asked for his name, telling him she was going to report him and something to the effect of "You can't just spray dogs."

She was walking along beside him when he said, "You're not getting any information from me...you can try to find out, but you won't." Roath stated Pagel then turned towards her and she put her hands up because she was scared of him. Then, Pagel, sprayed Roath in the face with pepper spray, causing her pain. All the while, Roath's dog was about 30 feet away, rolling around in the dirt as if he was trying to get the spray off of his face. Roath stated her dog did not approach her or Pagel again.

Roath stated Pagel then left her there and she yelled for help.

Eventually, what felt like to Roath a long time, someone came running out of the woods to help her.

Three days later, Pagel voluntarily came to the Missoula County

Sheriff's Office and met with Detective Newell. Pagel stated he has had
many bad encounters with dogs throughout his life and therefore carries
pepper spray with him in case he is confronted by a dog. On the day in
question, he was walking in the Pattee Canyon picnic area when he saw a
"big hairy" dog running toward him. He described the dog as possibly a
golden retriever. Pagel stated the dog was coming toward him too quickly,
so when the dog was ten feet away from him, he sprayed the dog.

Pagel stated the dog's owner was not calling off her dog. He said she became very vocal and demanded to know his name. He said that while he and the female were arguing, her dog came from behind her and approached him again. Pagel went to pepper spray the dog again when the female pushed him and he stumbled backwards. When he stumbled, he said, the pepper spray hit the female along her right arm and on the right side of her face. Pagel said there were people around and he did not want to deal with them, so he left.
