Code Ann. 45-5-210, punishable by not less than 2 years or more than 10 years MSP and \$50,000 fine; COUNT II: ASSAULT ON A PEACE OR JUDICIAL OFFICER, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-210, punishable by not less than 2 years or more than 10 years MSP and \$50,000 fine; COUNT III: NEGLIGENT ENDANGERMENT, a High Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-208, punishable by 1 year MCDF and/or \$1,000 fine; COUNT IV: DRIVING A MOTOR VEHICLE WHILE UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL OR DRUGS - 1ST OFFENSE, a Misdemeanor, in violation of

## AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

JENNIFER CLARK, Chief Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of HEATHER LEANE BENNETT for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint in and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On December 10, 2013, at around 11:00 p.m., Officers Woods and Hebert were driving on Mullan Road and stopped for a red light at W. Broadway in Missoula in an unmarked police vehicle. At the time, they

were the only vehicle at the intersection. When the light turned green, Officer Woods began to drive through the intersection. Both officers observed a vehicle on Broadway approaching the intersection and that did not appear to be stopping for the red light on Broadway. They braced themselves and the vehicle struck their vehicle. The driver of the other vehicle, later identified as Heather Bennett immediately got out of her car, approached the officers and asked "Are you drunk?"

Officer Hebert identified them as officers. Bennett appeared agitated and nervous. She admitted she had consumed alcohol prior to the incident and stated she had been drinking because her husband had been cheating on her.

Trooper Navarro arrived to investigate the crash. Bennett admitted she had been drinking and stated she was going to jail. Trooper Navarro could smell a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on her breath. Bennett had difficulty walking to his patrol car.

At the detention center, Bennett began to fight with staff and Trooper Navarro. She kicked Trooper Navarro in the shin, causing him pain. She bit Detention Officer Smolinski on the arm, causing him pain.
