AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

JASON MARKS, Assistant Chief Criminal County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of KEVIN JOSEPH LINO for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about the 5<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2014, a body was found floating in the Clark Fork River in Missoula County. The body was determined to be that of Berry "Jack" Gilbert. An autopsy was performed at the Montana State Crime lab and it was determined that the body had injuries that could not be explained by drowning or subsequent movement in the water.

Investigators with the Missoula County Sheriff's Department interviewed Gilbert's girlfriend Susan Prentkiewicz. She said that around July 30, 2014, a group showed up at a camp she was sharing with Gilbert under the Reserve Street Bridge. She said that

the group consisted of a man she knew as Phoenix, another man she knew as Kenny, and their girlfriends that she knew as Angie and Ginger. She said they were behaving very aggressively toward those already camped in that area.

She reported that Gilbert and Phoenix got into a verbal confrontation. At that point Kenny struck Gilbert in the head, knocking him to the ground. Phoenix and Kenny then kicked and stomped Gilbert and cut gang symbols into his body with a knife. She said that Kenny and Ginger then escorted her out of the area and left her at another camp. Shortly thereafter she heard a gunshot. She did not see Gilbert again. The next morning she encountered Phoenix who told her that Gilbert was "on a train back to Pennsylvania."

Based on descriptions of the group, investigators were able to identify "Kenny" as Kenneth Hickman. Susan subsequently picked him out of a photo lineup. Investigators identified "Ginger" as Mechailah Trembruell. Hickman and Trembruell were located by deputies at a camp near the Kim Williams trial. They were interviewed and identified Phoenix as Kevin Lino. They said Lino and his girlfriend had left town the night before after learning that deputies were investigating the homicide. They both reported that Phoenix had severely beaten Gilbert, who they knew as "Jack" around July 30<sup>th</sup>. Hickman admitted hitting Gilbert and knocking him to the ground, but said the rest of the assault was done by Lino. Hickman claimed not to have been present when Gilbert was killed. Trembruell contradicted this saying that both she and Hickman were present, after escorting Susan from the camp, when Lino shot Gilbert in the head with a 9mm pistol he carried and dumped the body in the river.
