COMPLAINT

JASON MARKS, Assistant Chief Criminal County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 12th day of October, 2014, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of COUNT I: CRIMINAL PRODUCTION/MANUFACTURE OF DANGEROUS DRUGS, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-9-110, punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine, COUNT II: CRIMINAL POSSESSION OF DANGEROUS DRUGS WITH INTENT TO DISTRIBUTE - ANY DRUG OTHER THAN AN OPIATE, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-9-103(3), punishable by 20 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine; COUNT III: CRIMINAL POSSESSION OF DANGEROUS DRUGS WITH INTENT TO DISTRIBUTE -ANY DRUG OTHER THAN AN OPIATE, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-9-103(3), punishable by 20 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine; COUNT IV: CRIMINAL ENDANGERMENT, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-207, punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine; COUNT V: CRIMINAL CHILD ENDANGERMENT, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-628(1)(d), punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine. The facts constituting the offense are:

COUNT I: On or about the 12th day of October, 2014, the above-named

Defendant knowingly or purposely produced, manufactured, prepared, cultivated,
compounded, or processed a dangerous drug, as defined in 50-32-101, to wit: hash oil.

COUNT II: On or about the 12th day of October, 2014, the above-named Defendant knowingly possessed a dangerous drug, as defined in 50-32-101, marijuana, with intent to distribute.

COUNT III: On or about the 12th day of October, 2014, the above-named Defendant knowingly possessed a dangerous drug, as defined in 50-32-101, psilocybin mushrooms, with intent to distribute.

COUNT IV: On or about the 12th day of October, 2014, the above-named Defendant knowingly engaged in conduct that created a substantial risk of death or serious bodily injury to Virginia Ervin to wit: conducting a butane hash oil extraction in an apartment while Virginia Ervin was in the apartment.

COUNT V: On or about the 12th day of October, 2014, the above-named Defendant committed the offense of criminal child endangerment by purposely, knowingly, or negligently causing substantial risk of death or serious bodily injury to a child under 14 years of age by manufacturing or distributing dangerous drugs in a place where a child is present.

AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

JASON MARKS, Assistant Chief Criminal County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of PATRICK WAYNE AUSTIN for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about the 12th day of October, 2014, Missoula City Police and fire department personnel responded to a report of an explosion at an apartment at 1010 Yreka Ct. in Missoula. Upon arrival officers noted that the windows in the apartment had been shattered and pieces of glass had been blown approximately 50 feet toward the sidewalk. Buds of marijuana were scattered outside the apartment. In plain view inside the apartment was a case of butane canisters.

Fire personnel found and unplugged a hotplate on the stove which had a Pyrex baking dish on it and turned off the pilot light to the water heater which was located in a

 closet off of the kitchen. The three occupants of the apartment, Patrick Austin, Virginia Ervin, and Ervin's 19 month old child, were all transported to the hospital for treatment of burns.

A search warrant was executed on the apartment by Missoula City Police detectives. Inside detectives found paraphernalia consistent with the production of hash oil from marijuana using butane, 1.67 pounds of marijuana, 8.3 grams of has oil, approximately half a pound of psilocybin mushrooms, over \$2200 in cash, a rifle, a purple respirator, and two boxes of butane containers. A check of Austin's Facebook page revealed numerous posts relating to his involvement in the manufacture and distribution of drugs.

Austin as interviewed at the hospital. He denied that he was involved in the production of hash oil. He claimed that he used to perform butane hash oil extraction but had stopped doing so after setting a shed on fire while doing the extraction. He was able to describe the process in great detail and his description was consistent with paraphernalia found in the apartment. Austin claimed that a gas leak must have caused the explosion. He said that the cases of butane in the apartment were because he buys in bulk to refill his lighter.

Ervin was interviewed next. She admitted that Austin has been using butane to extract hash oil from marijuana at the time of the explosion. She said normally he has her leave the apartment with her child while he is doing it. She was aware of a prior incident when he had been injured while performing an extraction. This time when he indicated he was going to be doing an extraction she just took her 19 month old child into another room to watch TV. She said that she had been working all day and "just

wanted to chill." She said about 15-30 minutes after Austin Started the extraction process she heard a loud "whoosh sound" and looked up to see the kitchen on fire. She then realized that both her and her child's hair were on fire. She believed the explosion had been caused by excess butane
