13	oath, deposes and says:		
14	I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of		
15 16	DAVID HARRIS STALLING for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the		
17	complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe		
18	probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the		
19	accompanying complaint.		
20	On or about April 26, 2015 at approximately 1:30 a.m., Officer Casey Williams of		
21	the Missoula Police Department responded to Noon's Sinclair gas station at 39 th and		
23	Russell for a report of an assault. Upon his arrival, Ivan Lemeza recounted the incident		
24	for Officer Williams. Lemeza said that he had gone into the store and purchased beer,		
25	snacks, and cigarettes and left. Once at his vehicle, Lemeza said he noticed the clerk,		
26	David Stalling, had failed to give him the cigarettes. When he returned to the store,		
27			

Stalling said there had been no error and that he had given Lemeza the cigarettes. An

argument ensued in which "F-words" were exchanged. Stalling then walked out from

behind the counter, grabbed Lemeza around the neck with both hands, and pushed him out of the store. Lemeza said Stalling continued to put pressure on his neck with both hands and continued to berate him. Lemeza reported that at this point he was in fear for his life and lost the ability to breath. He also believed he had lost consciousness at some point and was feeling dizzy and light-headed. Lemeza refused medical treatment but indicated he would go to the hospital on his own. Officer Williams examined Lemeza's neck and observed redness and peeled skin on the right side that covered a significant portion of his neck. Ivan's brother, Anatolie, witnessed the incident and relayed information similar to what Ivan conveyed. Anatolie said Stalling only relented when he approached Stalling and said he was going to call the cops.

Officer Williams spoke with Stalling who stated video surveillance would show he gave Ivan the cigarettes. Stalling said he had trouble with Ivan in the past and had previously kicked him out of the store on multiple occasions. Stalling stated he was actually quitting his job due to problem customers like Ivan and that this was his last night. Stalling reported that in this instance, Ivan used profanity and threatened to beat him up. Stalling asked Ivan to leave the store and take the issue to his supervisor the next day. Ivan refused and continued the verbal argument. Stalling said he then walked out from behind the counter, grabbed Ivan by the neck with both hands, and pushed him out the front doors. Stalling stated he lost his cool which was why he was leaving his position. In fact, Stalling admitted to Officer Williams that he had previously told a friend, "I better quit this job before I hurt someone."
