JORDAN KILBY, Deputy County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 21st day of February, 2016, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of COUNT I: AGGRAVATED ASSAULT - REASONABLE APPREHENSION, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-202, punishable by 20 years MSP and \$50,000 fine; COUNT II: ASSAULT ON A MINOR, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-212, punishable by 5 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine.

COUNT I: On or about the 21st day of February, 2016, the above-named

Defendant purposely or knowingly, with the use of physical force or contact, caused reasonable apprehension of serious bodily injury or death in Jane Doe by strangling her.

COUNT II: On or about the 21st day of February, 2016, the above-named Defendant, who is older than 18 years old, purposely or knowingly caused bodily injury to 16 month-old John Doe by hitting him and/or throwing him around.

AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

JORDAN KILBY, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of GLENN DANIEL SIPP-ANGST for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

Jane Doe reported, on or about February 21, 2016 around midnight, she and her intimate partner, Glenn Daniel Sipp-Angst (Defendant) began arguing. At 1:00 am her 16 month old son, John Doe, woke up and started crying. Jane Doe stated Defendant got mad because John Doe would not stop crying. She stated Defendant picked John Doe up and started yelling at him to shut up. She stated Defendant started to stuff baby wipes and socks into John Doe's mouth to make him stop crying. Jane Doe attempted to get John Doe away from Defendant.

Defendant yelled at Jane Doe and punched her in the upper right forehead area,

knocking her backward. Defendant then got on top of Jane Doe and started "choking her." Jane Doe stated he used both hands around the front of her neck and "choked her" to the point that she could not breathe. She stated she must have passed out because when she woke up, she was very confused and dizzy. Defendant was still on top of her when she woke up. Jane Doe stated she immediately pushed him off of her.

Defendant then went over to where John Doe was laying and knelt over him. She stated he grabbed John Doe near his throat with his right hand and was squeezing his face. She stated she thought Defendant was "choking" John Doe, but as she got closer, she saw Defendant's hand was more on John Doe's jaw and cheeks. Jane Doe tried again to get John Doe away from Defendant and Defendant "back handed" her causing her to fall backward.

Defendant then picked up John Doe and took him into the bathroom and locked the door. Jane Doe stated she could not get the bathroom door open so she was looking in through a small peep hole in the door. She stated Defendant put John Doe into the bathtub and started scrubbing his back with a scrubber. John Doe was screaming and crying the whole time. Jane Doe stated Defendant then picked up John Doe and threw him into the side of the washing machine. She stated Defendant then threw John Doe back into the bathtub.

Jane Doe stated Defendant came out of the bathroom with John Doe. She stated Defendant threw John Doe onto the bedroom floor and knelt over him again. She stated Defendant held John Doe's arms down with is left hand and started to hit John Doe in the face with his right hand. She stated Defendant used both open hand and closed fist strikes to John Doe. Jane Doe stated John Doe was crying and

screaming the entire time Defendant was handling John Doe.

Jane Doe tried to get Defendant off of her son when Defendant grabbed her by the throat and "choked her" again. She stated he "choked" her 4-5 times throughout the evening. Jane Doe stated Defendant finally got off of her and sat down in a chair. She stated she picked up John Doe and got him to calm down and go to sleep.

Sometime around 3:00 or 4:00 AM, Defendant fell asleep in his chair. Jane Doe picked up her son and snuck out of the room. She stated earlier in the night, Defendant had taken her cell phone telling her that it was his, so she didn't have a phone available to call anyone. She stated she entered her roommate's room and her roommate gave her a phone to call her father. Jane Doe's father picked them up and removed them from the scene.

Officers observed a bump on the back of John Doe's head and several scratches and bruises on his face. There were also marks on John Doe's chest and back.

Officers observed Jane Doe had several scratches on her neck. She has a bruise on her left thigh and several on her lower back.

Jane Doe's father provided a law enforcement with a text message he received from Defendant. In the text, Defendant threatened to shoot Jane Doe's father and anyone else he brought with him. After taking statements officers were able to confirm the assault occurred on the 1600 block of Cooley in Missoula County.
