



AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

MAC BLOOM, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath,
deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of
CAESAR JESUS REYES for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint
and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause
exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying
complaint.

On or about the 26th day of August, 2015, Officer Mattix, Missoula City Police
Department, responded to the Russell Street Albertson's regarding a stolen vehicle
report. Upon arrival, Officer Mattix made contact with Lauren Boling, who stated that
between noon and 3:00 p.m., her silver 2006 Jeep Liberty was stolen from the parking
lot. Lauren said that no one would have a reason to take her Jeep. She explained that
prior to the theft, her keys had been left in the glove box with the windows partially rolled
down.



1 Officer Mattix obtained surveillance footage of the parking lot and observed a
2 gold passenger car pull alongside Lauren's Jeep at approximately 12:08 p.m. An
3 unknown individual exits the gold car and approaches the passenger side of Lauren's
4 Jeep. Several seconds later, Lauren's Jeep is driven out of the parking lot.
5
6 Approximately fifteen minutes later, the tan passenger car can be seen leaving as well.
7 No suspects were identified at this time.

8 Later that same day, Officer Loya, Missoula City Police Department, responded
9 to the parking lot of Century Plaza on Stephens Avenue. Upon arrival, he met with
10 Lauren who informed him that one of her co-workers recently discovered her Jeep
11 parked there. With Officer Loya's permission, Lauren looked inside of her Jeep and
12 found that her iPod, REI tent, wallet, credit cards, ID, spare key, and various other items
13 had been taken. Lauren reported that the value of these items is around \$700. The
14 value of Lauren's Jeep is at least \$4,598 according to Kelly Blue Book.

17 On August 28, 2015, Trooper Kessler, Idaho State Patrol, contacted Officer
18 Mattix and informed him that he had recovered Lauren's stolen property in Idaho.
19 Trooper Kessler explained that he recently responded to a moving violation near
20 Lookout Pass. The car he pulled over had been reported stolen out of Missoula
21 (another car, not Lauren's Jeep). Trooper Kessler identified the driver as Caesar Reyes
22 (Defendant). During his search of the stolen car, Trooper Kessler found documents
23 belonging to Lauren, as well as the property that was stolen from her Jeep. Lauren was
24 later able to identify the recovered property as her own.
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27 On September 10, 2015, Detectives Manraska and Lang, Missoula City Police
28 Department, made contact with Defendant and attempted to interview him about this


1 incident. Although Defendant initially agreed to answer questions without an attorney
2 present, he repeatedly responded, "I don't want to answer that question" when asked
3 about his involvement.
4

5 On September 23, 2015, Detective Manraska executed a search warrant on a
6 backpack that was discovered in Defendant's possession when he was pulled over in
7 Idaho. Inside of the backpack was a set of Jeep keys. Lauren later identified the keys
8 as her own.







AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

12 MAC BLOOM, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath,
13 deposes and says:

14 I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of
15 CAESAR JESUS REYES for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint
16 and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause
17 exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying
18 complaint.
19

20 On or about the 18th day of June, 2015, Jason Widaman reported that his GMC
21 Sierra truck had been broken into sometime between 7:45 a.m. and noon the previous
22 day in the Park Place parking garage. He stated that his window had been shattered
23 and many of the items inside of his truck had been stolen. Jason provided a list of all
24 the stolen property to law enforcement. Of note, Jason's Garmin GPS unit, Swarovski
25 binoculars, and Philips DVD player were missing. He estimated the value of his
26 property to be \$6,891.75.
27
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1 At approximately 5:30 p.m. on June 18, 2015, Officer Emerson and Corporal
2 Kelly, Missoula Police Department, responded to Downtown Pawn in response to a
3 report that a man was attempting to pawn stolen merchandise. When the officers
4 arrived, they encountered a man by the name of Bruce Hill who was highly intoxicated.
5 Bruce denied knowing that the binoculars were stolen and informed the officers that a
6 young Native American male had offered to pay him \$20 to pawn the binoculars. Bruce
7 then led the officers to the Missoula County Courthouse lawn where they encountered a
8 group of intoxicated transients. Bruce stated that someone in that group had given him
9 the binoculars. All of the transients stated that an unknown African American male had
10 given them the binoculars, and informed the officers of his description and location. The
11 officers eventually found the African American male, who denied any involvement. After
12 this investigation, Jason was able to identify the binoculars as his own and retrieved
13 them from the Police Station.
14

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17 On June 19, 2015, Jason contacted police with further information regarding the
18 theft. He explained that he recently recovered his GPS unit from 1st Interstate Pawn
19 and learned that it had been pawned by Abby (aka Aubrey) Goetz. He also reported
20 that an unknown male, accompanied by Aubrey and another individual, previously
21 attempted to pawn the GPS at Downtown Pawn. Aubrey also attempted to pawn the
22 GPS at Riverside Pawn. Riverside Pawn provided a vehicle description and license
23 plate number for the vehicle in which Aubrey left the store.
24

25 On August 5, 2015, Detective Lang, Missoula City Police Department,
26 interviewed Aubrey at the police station. Aubrey stated that on the day of the theft, she
27 met her son's father, Caesar Reyes (Defendant), at Caras Park at approximately 5:00
28

1 p.m. Aubrey stated that Defendant gave her a "crappy" GPS unit and a set of
2 binoculars, which he wanted her to pawn for him as he did not have his ID. Aubrey
3 asked Defendant if the GPS was stolen and he claimed he had just purchased it from a
4 kid in Caras Park. Aubrey and Defendant then left the park and got Aubrey's mother's
5 van. They then drove to Riverside Pawn, which refused to take the GPS unit. After
6 being refused, the couple went to Walmart and then 1st Interstate Pawn, where Aubrey
7 pawned the GPS unit. When asked where she thinks Defendant obtained the GPS,
8 Aubrey stated that he "car hops" and uses "window breakers" to get into vehicles.
9
10 Aubrey also recalled seeing an emergency seat cutting tool in Defendant's possession.
11

12 Aubrey admitted to communicating with Defendant on Facebook about the GPS
13 unit. At some point during their conversation, Aubrey recalled that Defendant stated
14 "You know the deal. I'm out of the streets. I'm struggling." Based on this information,
15 Detective Lang obtained a warrant for Aubrey's and Defendant's Facebook accounts.
16 He discovered that nearly 100 messages had been sent between the two between June
17 17, 2015 and June 22, 2015, most of which had been deleted. However, in one
18 message that was not deleted, Defendant references a "charger for Aubrey's DVD
19 player." On September 23, 2015, Detective Manraska made contact with Aubrey
20 regarding this DVD player. Aubrey stated that Defendant gave it to her in Caras Park
21 around the time he gave her the GPS unit. Aubrey then gave Detective Manraska a
22 Philips brand DVD player, which Jason identified as stolen from his vehicle.
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
25 In another Facebook message, Defendant stated that "my habits have me
26 homeless stealing doing things I never would of done in Cali I am in a bad situation."
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1 Detectives Lang and Manraska attempted to interview Defendant, but he refused
2 to answer any questions about these events.


