AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

Brian Lowney, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of JEREMIAH R. KENDALL for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On June 2, 2016, officers were called to the report of an assault on the 100 block of Expressway Drive, Missoula County, MT. Upon arrival, officers contacted Jane Doe,

who told them that the night prior, the Defendant had assaulted her in her motel room. Doe indicated that she and the Defendant got into an argument on the night of June 1, 2016, and that Doe left for several hours. When Doe returned, the lights in the room were off. The Defendant was sitting in the corner of the room holding a gun.

The Defendant then put down the gun, grabbed Doe and threw her to the ground. Doe indicated that the Defendant struck her, put her in a "choke hold" and elbowed her in the ribs. During the assault, which Doe estimated lasted for approximately 10 minutes, the Defendant told Doe that he would kill her if she reported the assault to anyone. During the assault, the Defendant also damaged Doe's iPad.

After the assault ended, Doe spent the night in the room. The next morning, she went to the front desk, where staff noticed her injuries and called police.

Officers observed a fresh blue bruise under Doe's right eye, a cut on the lower right side of her chin, fresh scratches on Doe's collar bone and bruises on Doe's arms.

The Defendant was interviewed and denied causing Doe's injuries, but admitted to damaging Doe's iPad and possessing a gun.

The Defendant has at least two prior convictions for Partner Family-Member Assault, in violation of Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-206.
