COMPLAINT

17 SUZY BOYLAN, Deputy County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the
18 6th day of August, 2016, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of
19 COUNT I: PARTNER OR FAMILY MEMBER ASSAULT - 3RD OR SUBSEQUENT
20 OFFENSE, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-
21 206[3rd+], punishable by not less than 30 days or more than 5 years MSP and/or a fine
22 not less than \$500 or more than \$50,000; COUNT II: AGGRAVATED ASSAULT -
23 REASONABLE APPREHENSION, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont.
24 Code Ann. 45-5-202, punishable by 20 years MSP and \$50,000 fine; COUNT III:
25 CRIMINAL DESTRUCTION OF OR TAMPERING WITH A COMMUNICATION DEVICE, a
26 Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-6-105, punishable
27 by 6 months MCDF and/or \$1000 fine.

1 The facts constituting the offense are:

2 COUNT I: On or about the 6th day of August, 2016, the above-named Defendant
3 purposely or knowingly caused bodily injury to Jane Doe, a partner/family member, by
4 striking her on the side of her face/head.


6 COUNT II: On or about the 6th day of August, 2016, the above-named
7 Defendant purposely or knowingly, with the use of physical force or contact, caused
8 reasonable apprehension of serious bodily injury or death in another by strangling her.
9

10 COUNT III: On or about the 6th day of August, 2016, the above-named
11 Defendant purposely or knowingly destroyed or tampered with a telephone or other
12 communication device to obstruct, prevent, or interfere with the report to any law
13 enforcement agency of any actual criminal offense or actual bodily injury or property
14 damage, by taking Jane Doe's phone away from her.

AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

25 SUZY BOYLAN, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon
26 oath, deposes and says:

27 I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of
28 PETER MANEY for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and
based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists
to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying
complaint.

On or about the 7th day of August, 2016, officers responded to a call from Jane
Doe, who reported an assault by her partner, identified as the above-named Defendant.

1 Jane Doe was sobbing and said she thought Defendant was going to kill her. She
2 reported that her face and jaw hurt. Jane Doe reported that she believed Defendant is
3 currently using metamphetamine and alcohol.


5 Jane Doe reported to a patrol officer and a detective that she and Defendant had
6 argued at her residence. He started lighting her cigarettes and throwing them on the
7 carpet. She told him he had lost his mind and needed to leave. She went for her phone
8 and he grabbed it at the same time. He slammed her against the wall, grabbed her
9 breast hard and slammed her on the floor. She got away and ran to get a baseball bat.
10 She hit Defendant in self-defense. Defendant grabbed the bat and dragged her down a
11 hallway. Jane Doe tried to keep hold of the bat for fear that Defendant would use it on
12 her. He told her that she is the only person who is a threat to him and that she was
13 going to "die tonight." Defendant then started strangling her. Jane Doe couldn't breathe
14 and thought he was going to kill her. She was eventually able to run from her house to
15 her mother's house, where she called police. Defendant hit Jane Doe's iPad and took
16 her phone, two of her credit cards, her laptop, and her car key. He later called her sister
17 and told her he left Jane Doe's phone on a garbage can in an alley, where it was
18 located. Jane Doe reports having bruising on her neck.

22 A patrol officer contacted Defendant by phone. Defendant was evasive, said he
23 could not meet with the officer, then hung up. He did not answer when the officer called
24 back.




JUSTICE OF THE PEACE
