COMPLAINT

RYAN MICKELSON, Deputy County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 18th day of September, 2016, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of COUNT I: SEXUAL INTERCOURSE WITHOUT CONSENT, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-503, punishable by not less than 2 years or more than 100 years or life MSP and \$50,000 fine; COUNT II: BURGLARY, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-6-204(1), punishable by 20 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine. COUNT III: VIOLATION OF ORDER OF PROTECTION - 2ND OFFENSE, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-626(3)[2nd], punishable by not less than 24 hours or more than 6 months MCDF and a \$200-\$500 fine.

The facts constituting the offense are:

.

COUNT I: On or about the 18th day of September, 2016, the above-named Defendant knowingly had sexual intercourse with Jane Doe without consent.

COUNT II: On or about the 18th day of September, 2016, the above-named Defendant knowingly entered or remained unlawfully in an occupied structure and knowingly or purposely committed any offense within that structure, when he entered the residence of Jane Doe through her window without permission and had sexual intercourse with her without consent while inside the residence.

COUNT III: On or about the 18th day of September, 2016, the above-named Defendant committed the offense of violation of an order of protection when, with knowledge of the order, purposely or knowingly violated a provision of an order provided for in 40-4-121 or an order of protection under Title 40, chapter 15, by having contact with Jane Doe. Defendant was previously convicted of this offense on September 18, 2015, in Dillon City Court.

AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

RYAN MICKELSON, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of JASON DEVON LENOIR for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about September 19, 2016, Deputy Ryan Swearingin responded to a disturbance in progress in Missoula city limits involving Jason Lenoir violating a Temporary Order of Protection by contacting the protected party, Jane Doe.

Upon arrival on scene, Deputy Sweringin made contact with K.L., the individual who had reported the incident to dispatch. K.L., who is Doe's neighbor, stated that Jason would not leave Doe's residence after being told several times to leave by Doe. K.L. said Doe told Jason about the Temporary Order of Protection and eventually Jason left.

Doe relayed that while the incident was only a verbal disturbance, she was sexually assaulted by Jason on September 18, 2016. Doe said she went to a concert in downtown Missoula the evening of September 17, 2016. She indicated that she was intoxicated when she arrived home at approximately midnight. She said she remembered getting home and going to bed. Doe woke up at approximately 7:30 a.m. and saw Jason lying naked next to her in her bed. Doe was also naked. Jason told her that he had broken into her apartment and that they had sex. Doe said she had no recollection of the sexual assault, but noted there was fluid leaking from her vagina when she woke up.

Officers Pat Mulligan and Shaun Lloya responded to the scene at the request of the Sherriff's Office. Officer Mulligan spoke with Doe more in depth about the assault. Doe explained that she had been dating Jason Lenoir for approximately one year, but noted the relationship ended sometime around June of 2016. Jason then went to Texas. On September 11, 2016, Doe said that Lenoir returned to Missoula and made attempts to contact her. At that time, Doe indicated law enforcement contacted Jason and advised

him that he was trespassed from her residence. Law enforcement also told Jason that there was an outstanding Order of Protection that Doe had filed against him.

Doe stated that on September 17, 2016, she was at her apartment with her friend Z.Z. and was preparing to go out for the evening. At approximately 8:30 p.m.

Jason came by the residence. Doe said she had a brief interaction with Lenoir in which she told him she was going out and told him to go away, which he did.

Doe said she later attended a concert with Z.Z. and some other friends at Stage 112. At the concert she said that she had several drinks, including 4 shots of vodka, 2 shots of tequila and a "Dirty Shirley". Doe was then driven home from the concert by her friend, W.W. After W.W. left, the last thing she remembered was taking off all her clothes and going to bed. She awoke to her alarm in the morning to discover Jason naked in the bed next to her. She was startled and said that she told Jason she did not remember a thing. Jason proceeded to tell her he broke in through her front window and they had sex. Doe said she told Jason that he should have taken care of her. Jason responded that he found her passed out drunk and naked in bed, and that he did help her by cracking the window because she could have overheated.

Doe went on to explain the events that had transpired on this evening. She said the doorbell rang and she heard her neighbor K.L. speaking with Jason outside. Jason was telling K.L. that he had previously entered Doe's apartment through the window. At this point, Doe said she felt the need to interject. She opened her door and told Jason that he essentially raped her. She said Jason responded by implying she should be happy that it was him, as opposed to someone else.

While law enforcement spoke with Doe on the evening of September 19, 2016, Detective Arianna Adams interviewed Jason Lenoir at the police department. Jason was advised of his Miranda Warning and he agreed to answer questions.

Jason advised that he previously dated Jane Doe and that it was a rocky relationship. Jason said they broke up in May of 2016. Jason left for Texas on August 9, 2016. He indicated while in Texas, Doe blocked his number and his Instagram. He said they would only email, and eventually, Doe quit responding to his emails too.

Jason said he returned to Missoula from Texas on September 11, 2016. He noted that he and Doe did not have any kind of relationship at that time. Jason said he emailed Doe and told her he was on his way back to Missoula. He also told her he was going to try and go see her at the mall. Jason said when he went to Doe's residence law enforcement was called on him. Jason said the same day an officer told him that Doe did not want anything to do with him, and that an order of protection had been issued against him.

Jason said after the conversation regarding the order of protection, he went to Doe's house on September 17, 2016, and found her getting ready to go out. Jason said he left and returned about 1:30 a.m. When Doe did not answer the door, Jason indicated he removed the screen off of the window, opened the window and went into her residence. Jason said he found Doe "passed out drunk" in her room, "unclothed in her bed" and she "did not even know" he was there. Jason said he spent the night there and had sex with Doe.

He indicated that Doe was "really drunk" and that she did not remember having sex. Jason stated "technically that would be rape," but believed his situation was

different because they used to date. Jason said when he was speaking with her she was not responding. Jason performed oral sex on Doe first and realized she was drunk because she was "doing weird things" and would not "even open her eyes." Jason said when he started having sex with Doe that she was not talking nor did she open her eyes. Jason is not sure how long he had sex with Doe but estimates that it lasted 20 to 30 minutes. Prior to having sex with Doe, Jason said she was "pretty gone" but still had "motor control." Jason said he never had sex with Doe when she was that intoxicated in the past. While Jason was performing oral sex, Jason said she refused to kiss him because she hates him. Jason acknowledged that if she was not so drunk he would not have been able to get into the house and she would have told him to leave.

After the interview was conducted, a criminal history was run. It was learned Jason had a previous conviction for Violation of an Order of Protection on September 18, 2015, in Dillon City Court.
