COMPLAINT

RYAN MICKELSON, Deputy County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 15th day of November, 2016, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of COUNT I: ASSAULT WITH WEAPON, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-213, punishable by 20 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine; COUNT II: AGGRAVATED ASSAULT - REASONABLE APPREHENSION, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-202, punishable by 20 years MSP and \$50,000 fine.

The facts constituting the offense are:

COUNT I: On or about the 15th day of November, 2016, the above-named Defendant purposely or knowingly caused bodily injury to Doe with a weapon when he held a knife to her face and scratched her with the blade.

COUNT II: On or about the 15th day of November, 2016, the above-named Defendant purposely or knowingly, with the use of physical force or contact, caused reasonable apprehension of serious bodily injury or death in Jane Doe when he slammed her against a wall, bit her, punched her, strangled her and suffocated her several times, all while threatening to kill her, causing her to believe she was going to die.

AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

RYAN MICKELSON, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of JEROMEY GLENN JONES for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the above-named defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On or about November 15, 2016, at approximately 8:00 p.m., Deputies Hotchhalter, Wafstet and White were dispatched to the Bonner Town Pump to

investigate a report of a woman that walked in the store with no shoes on and was bleeding.

Deputy Hotchhalter arrived first. When he entered the Town Pump he observed a young adult female sitting at a table with other women around her. The female was crying, and he observed redness on her face, specifically around her nose and the left eye area. As he approached her, he noticed that she was not wearing any shoes.

Deputy Hotchholter identified her as Jane Doe. He asked her what happened, and Doe stated that she had "the shit kicked out" of her. At that time, EMS arrived and they began to check on Doe.

Deputy Hotchhalter then spoke to a witness, A.K., who works at the Town Pump.

A.K. said that Doe told her that Doe's boyfriend, nicknamed "Oreo", had assaulted her at their residence, and that Doe ran away barefoot.

At that time, "Oreo" walked up to the Town Pump. Deputy White asked him what his name was and he replied "Jeromey". Deputy Wafstet discovered that "Oreo" was the nickname for Jeromey Jones. Deputy Hotchhalter told Jeromey to place his hands behind his back as he was being detained for an assault investigation. During a pat down, Deputy Hotchhalter found a black folding knife in his rear right pants pocket.

Thereafter, Deputy Hotchhalter conducted a brief interview with Doe before she was transported to St. Pat's Hospital by ambulance. Doe told him that Jeromy threw her around like a pinball. She stated "he didn't hold back" and that he tried to kill her. She stated he covered her mouth and nose with his hands so she couldn't breathe for approximately one minute. Doe also said Jeromey placed his elbow into her throat and then let her go right before she passed out. Doe told him that Jeromey had slapped,

punched and banged her face into the wall as well as punched her in the nose. Doe fled her residence barefoot with her dog. Deputy Hotchalter asked Doe why this assault occurred, and she said it was because she had woken him up after he had been drinking. EMS then transported Doe to St. Pat's Hospital.

Deputy Hotchhalter then spoke with Town Pump employee, A.G. She stated she was working up front at the counter when she heard yelling by the main door. A.G. said she observed Doe standing by the front main door "covered in blood." She rushed over and tried to talk to Doe. A.G. said she found out that Jeromey had picked Doe up and threw her around as well as bit her. Doe told A.G. that Jeromey was drunk and that Doe had been "afraid for her life."

Deputies Hotchhalter and Wafstet learned that Doe and Jeromey lived in an RV. They found the RV and Sgt. Schmill went to St. Pat's and obtained consent from Doe to enter the RV to take photos. Deputies Hotchhalter and Wafstet entered the RV. There was blood on the white sheet on the bed. They also observed damage to the hallway wall as the wall was cracked and broken in. It appeared to be the size of a head.

Thereafter, Deputy Hotchhalter conducted a detailed follow up interview with Doe at the hospital. Doe stated at 1:00 p.m., Jeromey was drinking with the neighbors and she told him to stop, but he kept taking shots. Doe stated Jeromey acted like he was going to hit her and then threw her down on to the floor. She said he acted like he was going to smash her head into the floor but then let her up and said "it's ok, I love you." Doe said Jeromey went outside and vomited from being drunk. She helped him, and escorted him into the RV. She said that eventually he went to sleep.

Doe said when he woke up he began talking nonsense and accusing her of

cheating on him. Doe stated Jeromey began punching her and slapping her in the face. Doe said he picked her up and threw her down and into the wall. She said he threw her into the window, and pounded her head into the wall. She stated he bit her legs, arms, stomach and face. She said he also punched her arms, legs and stomach. Doe stated Jeromey got her on the floor, and he put both of his hands over her mouth and nose so she could not breathe. Doe said she tried to get him off of her but she was not strong enough to do it. She stated he waited "until the last moment before she blacked out" to let her go and breathe. She said he wanted to make sure she stayed awake. Doe stated Jeromey did this to her for a total of three times.

Doe stated Jeromey pulled out a black and blue spring loaded folding knife, held it to the corner of her left eye and told her that he was going to kill her as he scratched her face with the blade. Doe explained that Jeromey kept telling her "I'm going to kill you" and "your'e going to die." Doe also said that while they were on the floor, Jeromey tried to break her leg by laying down and pulling it up in a Mixed Martial Arts type of hold. The interview was then concluded.
