COMPLAINT

KARLA PAINTER, Deputy County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 9th day of April, 2017, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of COUNT I: BURGLARY, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-6-204(1), punishable by 20 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine; COUNT II: THEFT, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-6-301 (1) [4], punishable by 10 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine; COUNT III: CRIMINAL MISCHIEF, a

Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-6-101(1)[1], punishable by 6 months MCDF and/or \$1,500 fine.

The facts constituting the offense are:

COUNT I: On or about the 9th day of April, 2017, the above-named Defendant knowingly entered or remained unlawfully in an occupied structure, a garage at 8400 Vann Drive, with the purpose to commit an offense therein, to wit: theft of property including tools and a motorcycle.

COUNT II: On or about the 9th day of April, 2017, the above-named Defendant purposely or knowingly obtained or exerted unauthorized control over several tools, motorcycles, a stereo, and other various pieces of property owned by Grant Hellmuth, Joe, McGillivray, and Louis Hayes with the purpose of depriving the owner of the property. The value of the property exceeds \$1,500.00.

COUNT III: On or about the 9th day of April, 2017, the above-named Defendant committed the offense of criminal mischief by knowingly or purposely damaging or destroying the property, the interior of a Chevrolet pickup, belonging to Grant Hellmuth without consent.

AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE

KARLA PAINTER, Deputy County Attorney, Montana, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

I have read the official law enforcement reports regarding the investigation of BRIAN C BUCKREUS for allegedly committing the offense(s) set forth in the complaint and based upon the information contained in the

 reports, if true, believe probable cause exists to justify charging the abovenamed defendant as specified in the accompanying complaint.

On April 9, 2017 at approximately 4:00 p.m., Deputy Michael Hash responded to 8350 Van Drive in Lolo for a report of theft of tools from a construction site. The complainant, Grant Hellmuth, advised there were tools scattered all over the property and a small motorcycle had been stolen along with other tools. Hellmuth contacted Deputy Hash a short time later and stated a neighboring house to the construction site owned by Carol and Louis Hayes had been broken into as well.

When Deputy Hash arrived on the scene, Hellmuth approached him and said his acquaintance, Derek Zeiler, had located the stolen motorcycle at an address in Lolo. Zeiler explained that one of his employees named Eugene Mitchell resides at the residence. Hellmuth described the motorcycle as a blue and white Yamaha PW50 motorcycle with training wheels and a Yeti sticker on the back fender. Hellmuth said the motorcycle was worth approximately \$2,000. Zeiler subsequently accompanied Deputy Hash down Red Fox Road and showed him the motorcycle parked behind a camper on the property of 500 River Drive.

As Deputy Hash waited for Sergeant King to arrive to assist, Mitchell emerged from the residence and asked what was going on. Deputy Hash

informed Mitchel why he was there and requested permission to look at the motorcycle, to which Mitchell consented. Deputy Hash confirmed the motorcycle was Grant's. Mitchell stated the motorcycle belonged to someone else whom he identified as Brian. Sergeant King arrived on scene and started shouting at a male who was attempting to leave the area. Sergeant King stopped the male who identified himself as Brian Buckreus. Buckreus said he found the motorcycle alongside the road and picked it up and brought it to Mitchell's house. Deputy Hash inquired why Buckreus did not report the abandoned motorcycle and Buckreus stated he found the motorcycle that morning and just did not get around to it.

Deputy Hash observed three vehicles in the driveway and asked Buckreus which was his. Buckreus identified a black Dodge Ram 1400. Deputy Hash observed the interior of the pickup and noticed a red Milwaukee brand job site radio in the backseat. Deputy Hash then spoke with Hellmuth who stated the radio was his and was approximately \$400.

Mitchell stated Buckreus had stored other property in the barn. Deputy

Hash requested to look in the barn and Mitchell consented. When he
opened the barn he said everything just inside the door belonged to

Buckreus and that everything from a crib, which was about halfway in the
barn, and back belonged to Mitchell. Among Buckreus's property Deputy

Hash observed a Milwaukee brand electric grease gun, a Milwaukee brand circular saw, and a yellow case that appeared to be a case for storing tools. Deputy Hash photographed the property and showed it to Hellmuth who stated the grease gun (approximately \$450) and the saw (approximately \$300) belonged to him and that the yellow case stored a transit that belonged to Joe McGillivray. Deputy Hash later spoke with McGillivray who confirmed the transit was his and stated it was worth approximately \$1,500.

Deputy Hash then approached Buckreus and advised him of his Miranda rights. As he did so, Buckreus turned around and put his hands behind his back and took a posture as if he was going to be arrested. When Deputy Hash informed Buckreus of the results of his investigation, Buckreus stated, "I don't know what to say." Buckreus then invoked his right to an attorney and Deputy Hash arrested him for felony theft. Deputy Hash requested a tow company respond to the vehicle and store Buckreus's truck to a secure warehouse pending a search warrant.

Deputy Hash returned to scene of the thefts and met with Hellmuth who walked Deputy Hash through the construction site. Deputy Hash noticed a set of tire tracks that matched the tires on Buckreus's truck. The door to the work trailer located on the site was wide open and there was a tool belt on the ground near the trailer as well as a transit in an open case.

where the suspected wheeled the motorcycle into the ditch and walked it to the west to Mitchell's residence. Hellmuth also showed Deputy Hash several boot prints in the dirt and stated that he followed them to where he was storing a pancake air compressor (approximately \$250) which was now gone. Deputy Hash later seized Buckreus's boots and observed the tread patterns appeared identical to the prints left at the scene.

Hellmuth said the motorcycle was in the trailer and showed Deputy Hash

Hellmuch provided a list of items he had discovered stolen. It included: a Dewalt corded impact gun with 6 impact sockets, a cordless Milwaukee impact gun with batter, a Cabelas game camera, a Bosch eye transit, a Dewalt 30 foot tape measure, and a Shark shop vacuum. Hellmuth said the impact gun was in a black carrying case and Deputy Hash recalled such a case in the bed of Buckreus's Dodge Ram.

Hellmuth advised that he had been to the construction site on Saturday, April 8, about midday and determined no one had been on the property since the gate was closed. When Hellmuth returned on April 9, he discovered the gate open, the tool trailer open, and the items missing. Hellmuth said Buckreus was a concrete worker and that his tasks on the site would have been completed by April 4, thus he should not have been on the site after that date.

After Deputy Hash departed the scene, Hellmuth contacted him and stated he discovered a plow truck at the site had been broken into and damaged. Deputy Hash later returned and viewed the interior of an early 1980's Chevrolet pickup and noted the stereo had been extricated leaving several wires dangling. Hellmuth stated he believed the stereo was a Son Xplod valued at approximately \$50.

On April 10, Deputy Hash responded to 8400 Vann Drive and met with Louis Hayes. He stated that he had looked through his house and garage and discovered that a table saw and a yellow 1971 Honda Trail 90 motorcycle had been taken from the garage. Deputy Hash recalled such a motorcycle and a table saw next to the Yamaha motorcycle he recovered at 500 River Drive. Deputy Hash observed the rear door to the garage had been forced open, with damage to the door and lock. Inside the garage, several miscellaneous tools were scattered throughout. Carol Hayes advised Deputy Hash the house was mostly empty as she and her husband were preparing to sell it.

Deputy Hash returned to 500 River Drive and located the yellow Honda
Trail 90 behind the shed. Deputy Hash spoke with Mitchell whom indicated
Buckreus brought the motorcycle and table saw to the residence around the
same time. Mitchell stated he moved both out of the way in an effort to clean

up the property. Mitchell voluntarily retrieved the table saw and turned it and the motorcycle over to Deputy Hash. Deputy Hash then requested to see the inside of the barn again. Mitchell consented and Deputy Hash observed the stereo that had been removed from the Chevrolet pickup.
