SELENE M KOEPKE, Deputy County Attorney, deposes and says that on or about the 18th day of June, 2017, in Missoula County, the Defendant committed the offenses of COUNT I: ASSAULT WITH WEAPON, a Felony, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-5-213, punishable by 20 years MSP and/or \$50,000 fine; COUNT II: DISORDERLY CONDUCT, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-8-101(2), punishable by 10 days MCDF and/or \$100 fine; COUNT III: CRIMINAL TRESPASS TO PROPERTY, a Misdemeanor, in violation of Montana law, namely: Mont. Code Ann. 45-6-203, punishable by 6 months MCDF and/or \$500 fine. The facts constituting the offense are:

COUNT I: On or about the 18th day of June, 2017, the above-named Defendant purposely or knowingly caused reasonable apprehension of serious bodily injury in John Doe by use of a weapon or what reasonably appeared to be a weapon, to wit: an axe.

COUNT II: On or about the 18th day of June, 2017, the above-named Defendant knowingly disturbed the peace by fighting or challenging to fight L.C. and/or using threatening or profane language against P.B.

responded to the Potomac area for reports of an assault with a weapon. Upon arrival,

 Deputy Dunster met with John Doe, who reported that Michael Brewer ("Defendant") had come out of P.B's house with an axe, threatening to kill him. John Doe was visibly upset. He stated that he didn't know what he was going to do because the driveway was curvy and he didn't think he was going to be able to back away fast enough. At one point, Doe stated he thought he was going to have to run Defendant over with the car to get away from him. Doe reported that Defendant threw the axe at Doe's vehicle. Another individual, P.H. was also present while this occurred. Both Doe and P.H. stated due to their prior knowledge of Defendant and his erratic behavior, that they were concerned for their safety.

Deputy Uriarte interviewed A.W., who reported that there had been a wedding over the weekend which all parties attended. Earlier that day, Defendant showed up at A.W.'s residence, intoxicated. A.W. convinced Defendant to go help the cleanup crew from the wedding, believing it would help Defendant sober up. Defendant continued to drink. As the day progressed, Defendant became more aggressive and belligerent with friends and family, and threatened to shoot people. Deputy Hanson interviewed several other parties, including L.C., S.C., S.W., and N.M. L.C. stated that he gave Defendant a ride down from the wedding site, and during the ride, Defendant became more irritated and irrational. Defendant indicated he could shoot and kill them and he would be fine with it. Defendant also directly threatened L.C., stating he could kill him just as easily. L.C. stated that when Defendant said this, he would imitate a gun with his hand, extending his pointer and middle finger, and his thumb drawn back. Defendant ended up at A.W.'s house again, and A.W. enlisted the help of P.B. to get him to leave. P.B. stated that Defendant would not leave as asked and called her rude and unsavory

names. P.B. then called Doe to help facilitate Defendant's remove from the property.

Doe was able to get Defendant off the property, but Defendant would not leave with him.
