## “Sharing the Spirit 2015” Workshop

**Friday, April 3 and Saturday, April 4**

Experience Oklahoma’s American Indian History via the Wichita Mountains Wildlife Refuge with Jimmy W. Arterberry, Comanche scholar, historian, artist and Tribal Historic Preservation Officer for the Comanche Nation. Participants will experience the refuge taking part in a lecture with journaling/sketching field trip. The following day, they will meet in Lawton, OK to create an interpretive piece in a medium of choice – drawing, painting, poetry, song, short story, film, beading or leatherworking in a studio setting. Limited art supplies are provided; participants are welcome to bring their own media. Lunch is not included in cost of program.

Due to sensitive nature of the refuge, workshop is limited to 20 participants. Youth 17years and under must have parent/guardian also enrolled. Workshop is scheduled no matter the weather. Cost is \$35/person. Pre-registration with payment is required. Registration as well as cancellation deadline for refund is Friday, March 27, 2015.

**Day 1 - Friday, April 3,** Meet at the Arts & Humanities Division at 8am. The group will then travel to the Wichita Mountains Wildlife Refuge for lecture with journaling/sketching from approximately 9am – 2:00pm. Participants have an opportunity to examine the sites from their own creative perspective by taking notes, photographing and journaling. These sites are an easy walk but note that this involves natural terrain and comfortable shoes are recommended. Bring sack lunch and light snack. The refuge is for wildlife, rules and regulations of the refuge will be followed. What is brought into the refuge will be packed out when leaving.

**Day 2 - Saturday, April 4,** Creative Expressions in Studio, 9am – 5pm. Studio time will be held at Old Town Hall/Carnegie Library in downtown Lawton. Each participant will create a response to his/her onsite experience. Participants are welcome to bring their own media and supplies such as beads, leather, basket weaving materials, etc. Limited art supplies that will be available include acrylic paint, watercolor, tempera, color pencils and markers. Previous experience with creative/artistic media is helpful but not required. Lunch is on your own.
