At the time of his selection by Bassett, Dr. Ibrahim was the Executive Vice President, Chief Physician Executive for Oklahoma-based INTEGRIS. INTEGRIS is ranked as one of the top 25 health care systems in the nation.

"Since coming to Bassett in the summer of 2020, I have been impressed by the quality of the caregivers and practitioners who expertly and caringly serve our patients, day-in and day-out," reports Dr. Ibrahim. "Their relentless pursuit of excellence gives me a tremendous sense of optimism for the future."

- Opening mass vaccination clinics for broader patient convenience
- Engaging Press Ganey high reliability training for all caregivers
- Providing on-demand video services for our patients
- Launching the Strongline security system for employee safety
- Crafting a 5-year capital campaign to help fund greatest needs in facilities, programs, research, education and community

Originally scheduled to expire in December 2024, Dr. Ibrahim's contract has been extended through the end of 2029.

"I am so honored to have the early opportunity to keep our good work going as we continue preparing Bassett Healthcare Network for the decades ahead as a leading care provider for healthy rural communities," says Ibrahim. "The past two years were incredibly difficult, as we took important steps to create a sustainable foundation to build upon. I am deeply appreciative of our system and entity boards for their unwavering support. Our leadership teams have done a masterful job to get us here, and we're still only getting started."
